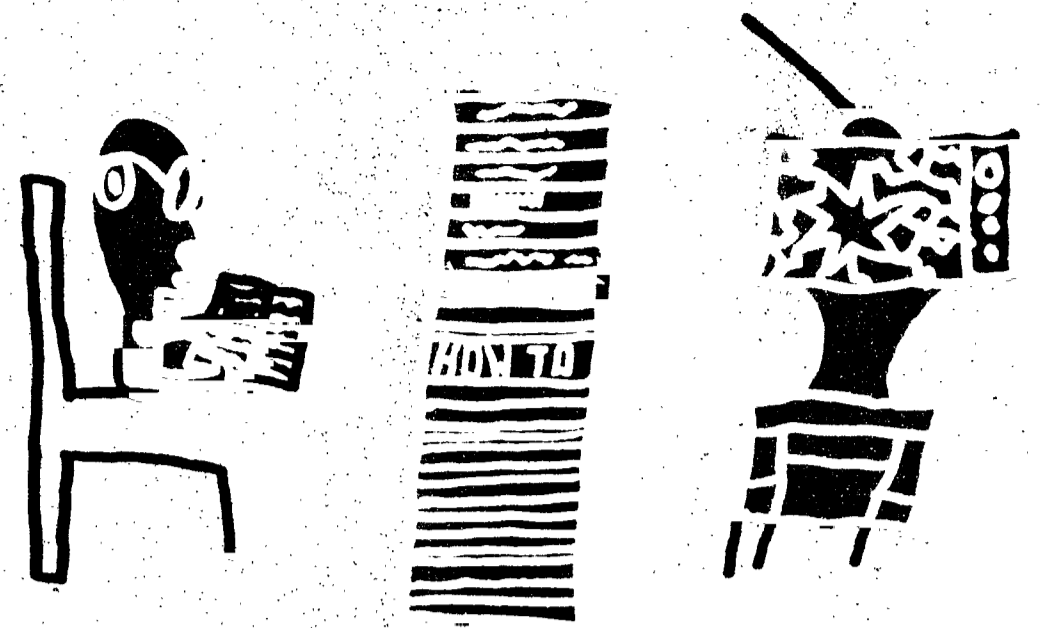
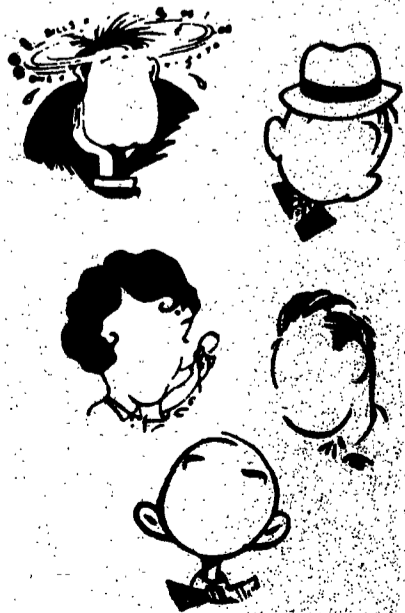
Hello,

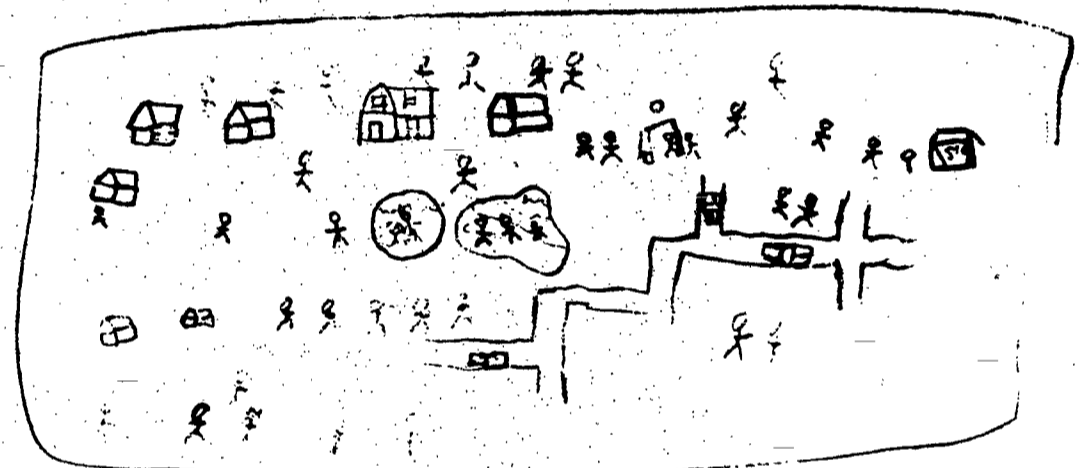
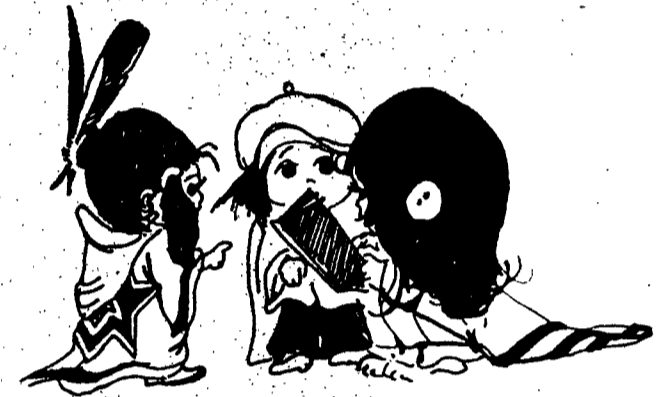

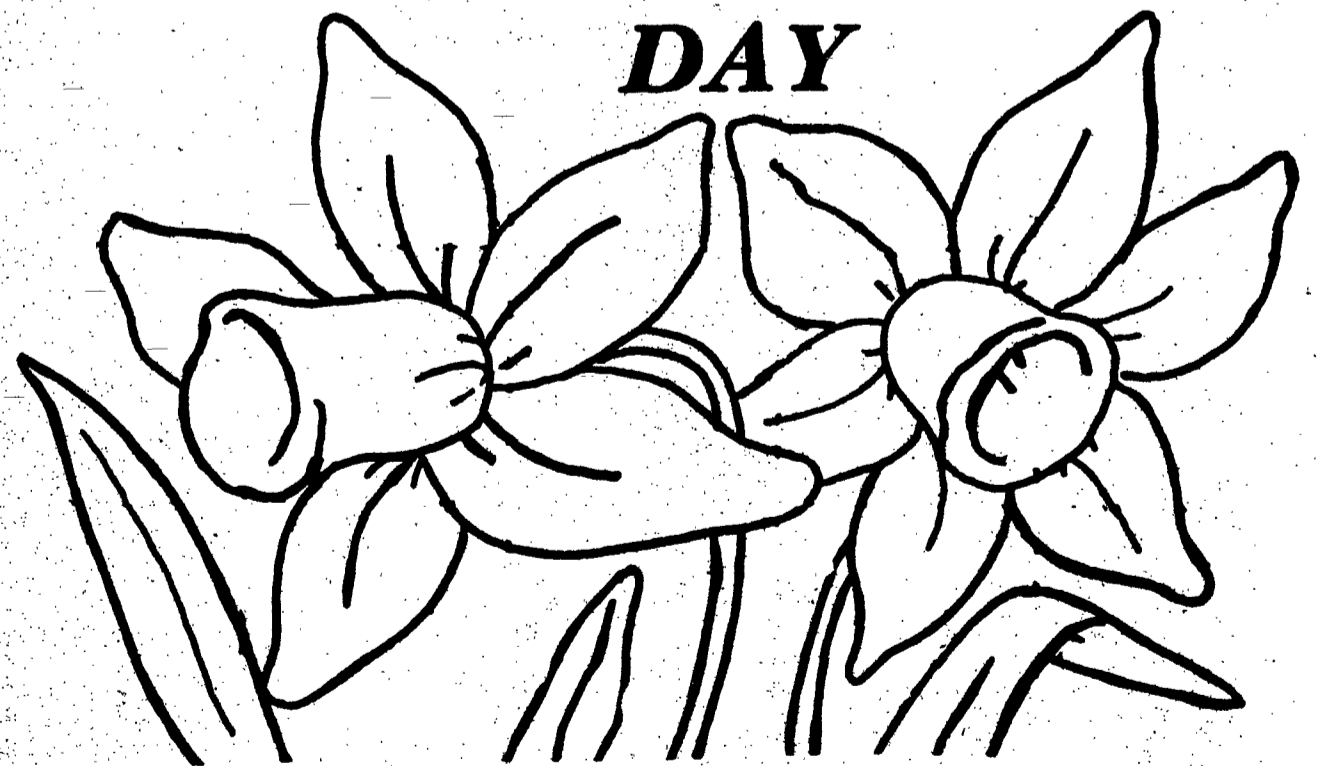
