In a time when lives are in transition often the right information can help people take the next step in planning their lives. The Massena Task Force on Retraining and Small Business has for the past several months been attempting to put the right information together, and on May 20th there will be a culmination of those efforts when 25 agencies gather at the Massena Central High School for "The Next Step Information Fair".

Tables will be set up with representatives of family service, education, banking and employment agencies available to answer questions on an individual basis.

For those who wish, in an adjoining room, agency members will present a short discussion on what services are provided. The fair, which will run from 7-10 p.m., is open to all interested persons but is especially geared toward those contemplating going back to school, changing jobs, or those who have recently lost their jobs.

June O'Neill, Chair of the Information Fair, said that "We are very concerned people who have been laid off or want to go through retraining and may not be aware of the next step to take to accomplish that goal."

"We felt that by getting all of the agencies together we could make this a profitable evening by saving people time and energy. This way everything they need is under one roof and they don't have to run from one agency to another."

O'Neill said that the emphasis of the Next Step Information Fair is one of people helping themselves by having the facts they need to direct their lives.

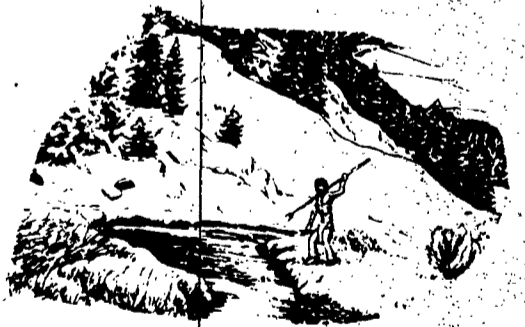

55 Alive/Mature Driving Retraining Program

When: May 19 and 21, 1987 1:00-5:00 p.m. (Both sessions required for completion certificate.)

Instructor: Floyd Morter, Canton, N.Y.

Fee: \$10.00 made payable to AARP for course materials and program support. (Course completion makes you eligible for auto insurance premium reduction - check with your agency for details.)

You will not be asked to take a written or a road test.

This is an 8-hour course for mature (over 55 years) auto drivers. It is locally sponsored by Cooperative Extension, Home Economics Program, but is under the direction of the American Association of Retired Persons and is recognized by the National Safety Council. The course instructor is trained and certified by AARP.

55 Alive/Mature Driving is an innovative classroom, driver retraining program designed to help older persons improve their driving skills, drive safer, and maintain their licenses longer.

Course content includes: information on the effect of aging and medication on driving, basic driving rules, license renewal, local traffic hazards, adverse road conditions, accident prevention measures, and a special section on vision and the aging process. While you will not be individually tested on the material covered, you will have a chance to use group discussion and analysis and will review the New York State Driver's Manual.

You can be a safe driver and maintain your license and insurance coverage! Sign up now - class size is limited to 20 participants.

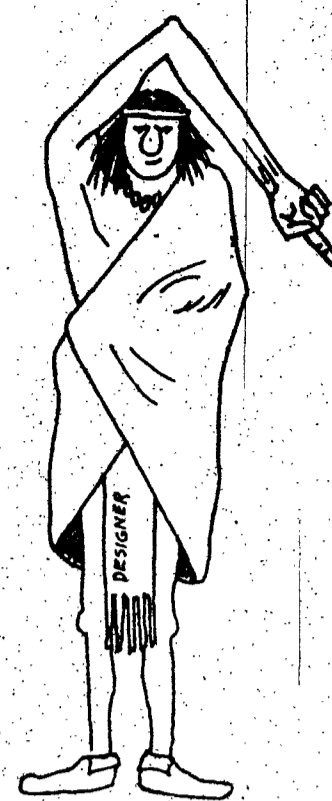

RRAP

Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program

RRAP is intended to assist in financing the repair of housing to achieve a state of repair that not only meets health and safety standards but extends the useful life of the dwelling unit substantially. A guideline of 15 years further life is suggested. It is, however, important that this guideline not be construed as authorization to replace all building components having a life expectancy of less than 15 years if such components are performing in an acceptable manner. Components should not be replaced if repairs, at a lesser cost, are feasible. The decision to repair or replace components should be based on the principle of "best buy".

To be eligible for funding under RRAP, dwelling units, in addition to being located in a designated area, must be deficient in at least one of the following six areas:

1. Structural soundness (including weather resistance of roofs and walls and termite infestation)
2. Fire Safety
3. Electrical System
4. Plumbing System
5. Heating System
6. Accessibility for disabled occupants.
