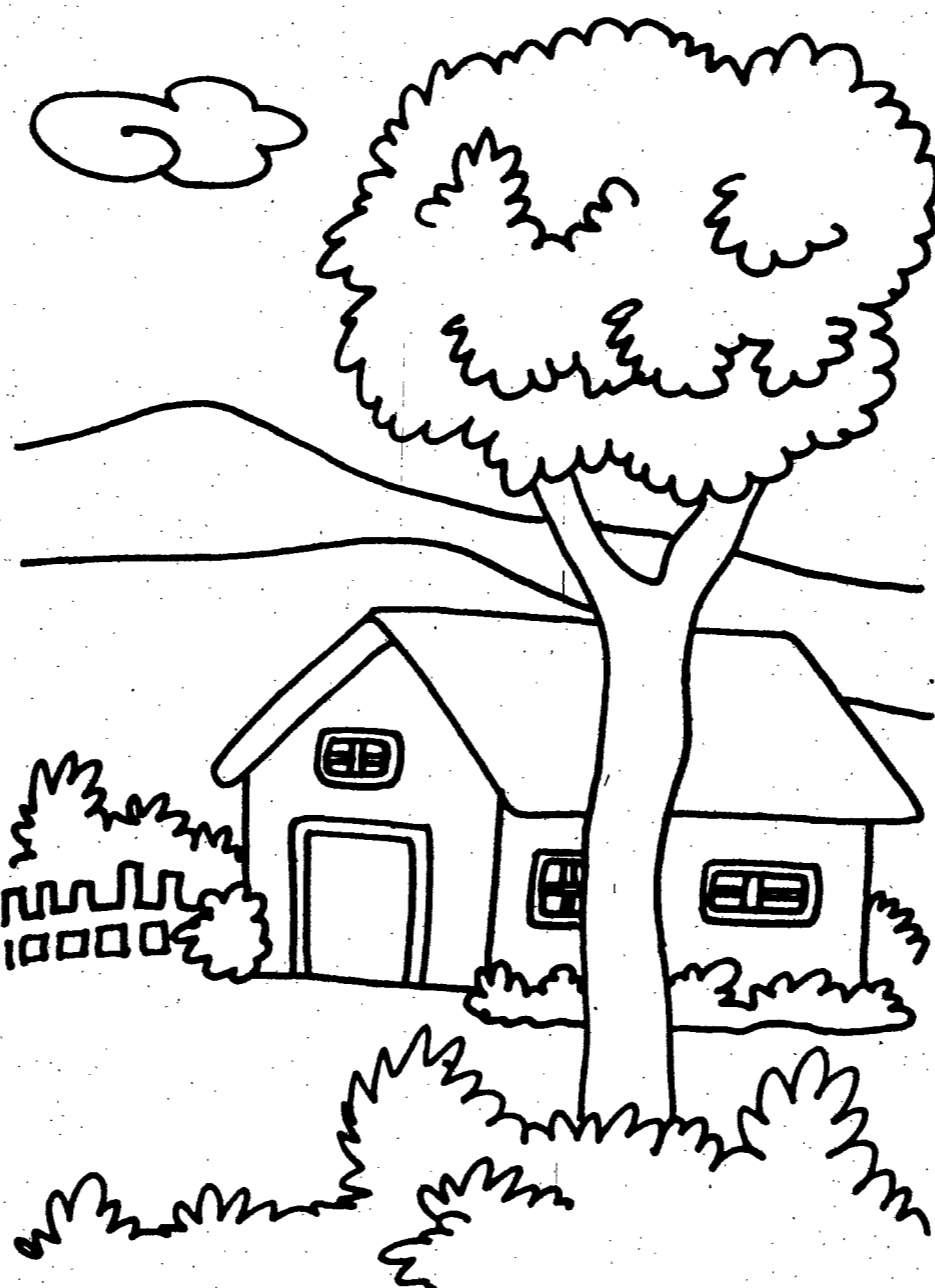

LOGIC PROBLEM

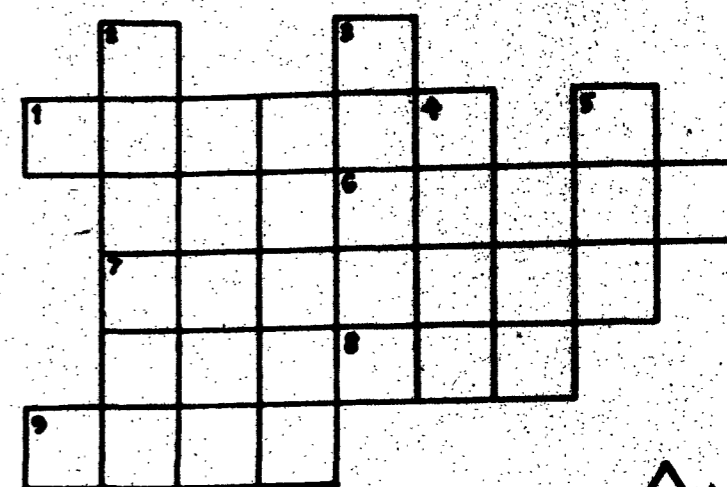
IN THE WAITING ROOM

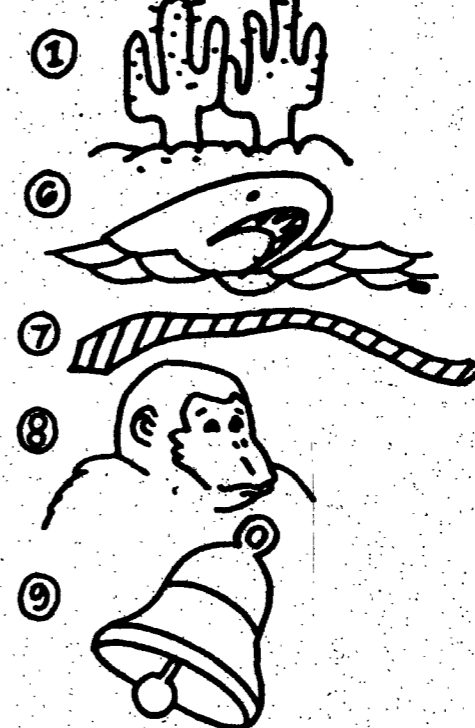
- The person who spent the time writing a letter was sitting to the left of the teacher and to the right of Sandy, although not next to both.
