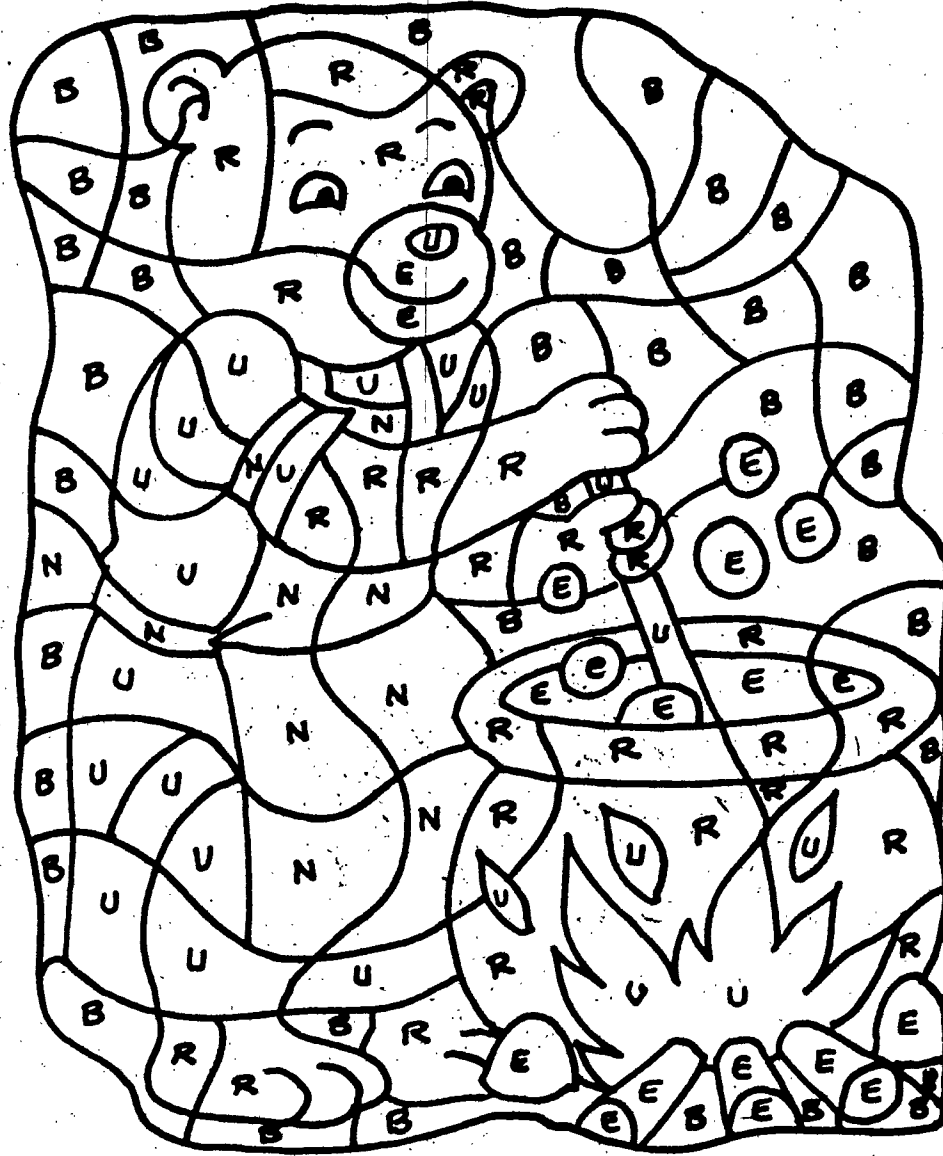
These are one-a-minute questions; all you have to do is decide how to do them. The whole quiz should be done in eight minutes, or it doesn't count. Ready? Go!

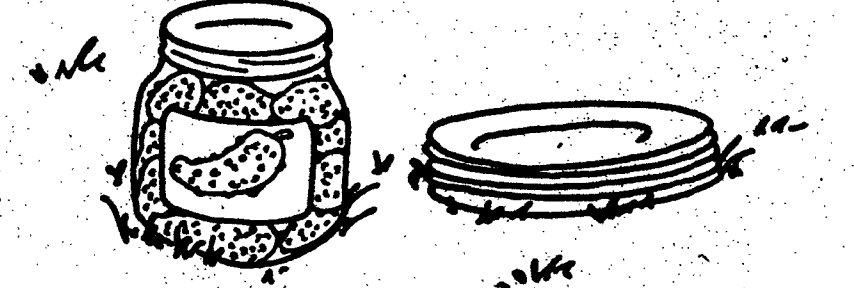
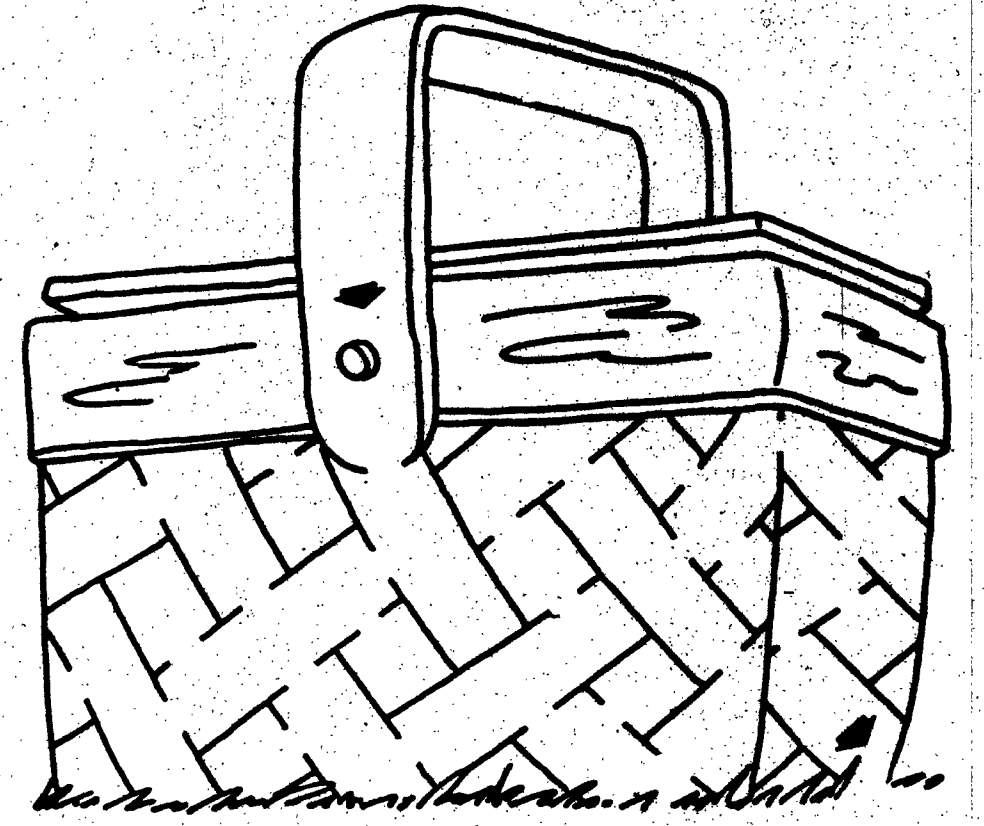
