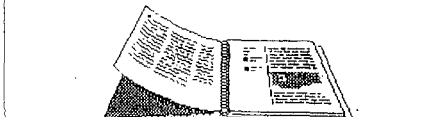

MATER DEI COLLEGE ST. REGIS MOHAWK / AKWESASNE BRANCH CAMPUS SPECIAL COURSES TO BE OFFERED AT HOGANSBURG IN MAY-JUNE

Mater Dei College will be offering some special courses at the St. Regis/Akwesasne Branch Campus in Hogansburg from May 8 through June 22. Classes will meet twice a week for seven weeks, on Mondays and Thursdays only.

12 noon - 3:00 p.m.
BUS.141 BASIC TYPING: A beginning course in typewriting especially for non-secretarial majors. This course includes basic keyboard mastery, typing of letters, tables, rough drafts, and term papers. (3 credit hours) **The course will be taught in the new cellar classroom in Mohawk Community Building and will be limited to 10 participants.

R.S. 250 CHRISTIAN MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE: Marriage will be considered as a vocation, covenant, and sacrament. Discussion will center on the nature of love and human relationships, family life, and contemporary problems pertaining to marriage and family life, with emphasis on the insights of Scripture and Tradition. (3 credit hours) **This course is FREE for anyone desiring to AUDIT it. It will be taught in the cellar classroom of Mohawk Community Building.
4:00 - 6:45 p.m.
COMP.SCI. 103 INTRODUCTION TO COMPUTERS: A brief overview of computers and their major applications. Topics include familiarization with computers, operating systems, programming, word processing, database and spreadsheet applications. Students will use APPLE II computers. (3 credit hours) **This course will be taught in the Akwesasne Library and Cultural Center and will be limited to 12 participants.

ENV.SCI. 201 ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE: A study of the interrelationships of living things with the non-living part of their environment. Students will have field-trip experiences. (3 credit hours) **This course will be held at the Mohawk Elementary School in Hogansburg.

ART 155 WATER COLOR: Fundamental theory and basic techniques of painting in water color, touching on the historical and traditional aspect of the medium. (3 credit hours) **This course will be held in the Mohawk School Art Room, Hogansburg.

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND MARKETS

The New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets and Alfred Agricultural and Technical College in Alfred, New York has developed a work/study program to train minority students for employment with this Department as Farm Products Grading Inspectors

The educational requirements of the program consist of being eligible to enroll in Alfred State College.

The work requirements consist of passing a color perception test, which will be given at the time of the initial interview, successfully complete the academic requirements each year and provide the transportation needed to carry out the inspections assignments on or before the date of their first seasonal employment.

The Inspectors will be responsible for (after training) inspection, grading and certification of farm products at shipping points, receiving points and processing plants generally within a 75 mile radius of Rochester, New York. This service is used for settling disputes, establishing product value and certifying export and contract requirements. Traditionally, such Inspectors can earn \$7000 - \$8000 during each 20 week season.

Highlights of the Program are included in the enclosed brochure.

The financial assistance the Department was offering has been abated, for the time being, because of the State's financial situation. However, we expect to resume the \$600 grant when this financial situation is eased. Those students in the Program at that time will then begin to receive the \$600 Grant.
