1990 Sewage Projects

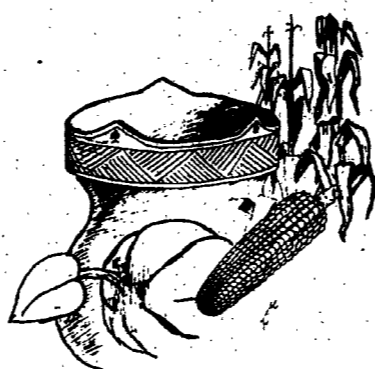

Straight From the Kitchen

Chicken Curry

- Chicken cut in eight
- *seasoned flour
- 1/2 cup diced onions
- 1/4 cup diced mushrooms
- 1 cup crushed tomatoes
- 2 cups chicken stock
- 1/4 cup white wine
- 1/2 cup grape halves
- 1/2 pound of butter
- 2 tablespoons curry powder

Coat chicken with seasoned flour and brown in hot butter. Remove chicken and place in casserole dish. In a frying pan with butter add celery, onion and mushroom, sautee until tender. Add tomatoes, chicken stock and white wine, simmer 2 minutes. Pour liquid over chicken and place in oven for 45 minutes. Remove from the oven, take off grease, add sliced grapes and diced apple, return to oven for 15 minutes remove and serve.

Craft Work Wanted

The Adirondack North Country Crafts Center (ANCCC) in Lake Placid wishes to obtain work from the craftspeople in Akwesasne. One option open to you is to submit your work on consignment. A second option is to submit five (5) to ten (10) slides of your work into their Slide File for wholesale and other buyers. It is not necessary to have material left on consignment to be represented in their Slide File.

The ANCCC is operated by the Adirondack North Country Association, which serves the fourteen counties of upper New York State. ANCCC functions as a year round showcase of regional craftwork, offering quality work in a range of types and prices.

If your choice is to offer slides of your work for wholesale and other buyers, you must complete a craft producer file form (a single sheet). You may write to ANCCC or come into the Planning Office for a craft producer file form. You mail your slides and the completed craft producer file form into ANCCC and your slides will be placed in the Slide File.

If you are interested in leaving your work on consignment, you must examine their requirements and return the appropriate information to the ANCCC. The material detailing the requirements can be obtained from the Planning Office or the ANCCC. Your work will be juried by the ANCCC. Jurying is done at least once a month. If your work is accepted, you will sign a consignment agreement which explains all the benefits and requirements.

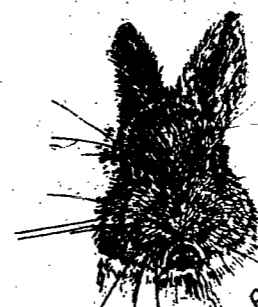
St. Lawrence River Remedial Action Plan

The St. Lawrence River- Massena Remedial Action Plan, Citizens Advisory Committee will meet on April 12, 1990, at the Massena Town Hall at 7:00 p.m. according to R. Shawn Gray, chairman. Mr. Gray explained, "The meeting will include a review and discussion of chapter #5, Sources of Contaminants and Disturbances in the St. Lawrence River. This is the last chapter of the stage 1 Remedial Action plan to be reviewed. The Citizens Advisory Committee will host a public meeting on the completed Stage 1 draft RAP report in May.

The Stage 2 RAP report outline, which will review remedial options and make recommendations and commitment for remedial actions, will be discussed. Representatives of the GM Central Foundry will be present GM's recommended remedial options for the industrial hazardous waste sites. This presentations will be made only if the USEPA has made the Proposed Remedial Action Plan public.

The meeting is open to the public and we advise and encourage public involvement.

Law Enforcement Task Force Member Hired as Coordinator

In an act of generosity four members of the St. Regis Mohawk Tribal Council selected Julius Herne as its \$420 a week coordinator.

Citing his "strong" connections in Albany, his "two weeks in North Carolina" and a "number of days" on an unnamed Seneca reservation the Task Force agreed to pay Herne the amount he asked for because Herne insisted his "unique qualifications more than justify this amount."

Only five of the nine member Task Force were present. Voting for hiring Herne were Rudy Hart, George Bero, Jerry Cook and Mark Garrow. Not present at the April 3 session were Beverly Cook, Lloyd Benedict, Harris Cole and Russell Lazore.

The Herne hiring was endorsed by tribal chiefs Leo David Jacobs and Lincoln White.

The Task Force was created by the Tribe to create a law enforcement agency at Akwesasne.

In other business the Force agreed to travel to North Carolina to examine a police agency there.

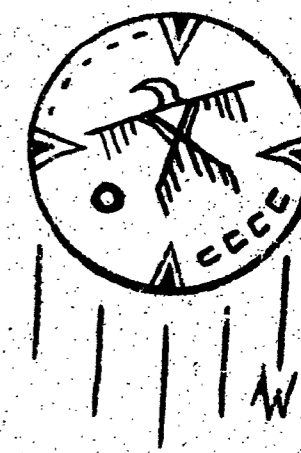
