**Report Your
1990 Crops**

As soon as all your program crops are planted this year, report these acreages to the ASCS office.

June 15 is the deadline to report 1990 Barley, Oat, and Wheat Acreage. Failure to file an accurate acreage report could cause producer to lose program benefits or the reduction or loss of the farm's crop acreage base (CAB).

July 16 is the deadline to report 1990 Corn Acreage.

Zero Acreage Reports can also be accepted to retain a farm's crop acreage base of the program crop (corn, oats, barley, wheat) is not being planted in 1990. Applicable deadline mentioned above apply to individual crops for zero acreage reports.

Prevented Plantings & Failed Acreage

If natural causes prevent a farmer from planting his corn, an application for disaster history credit must be filed by June 25. Any failed acreage must be reported and inspected before a crop is destroyed.

Commodity Certificates

All Commodity Certificates have an expiration date. Make sure you don't let your Certificate expire. If you are an original holder, check the expiration and cash redemption dates. You can redeem Certificates for cash with this office after the cash redemption date.

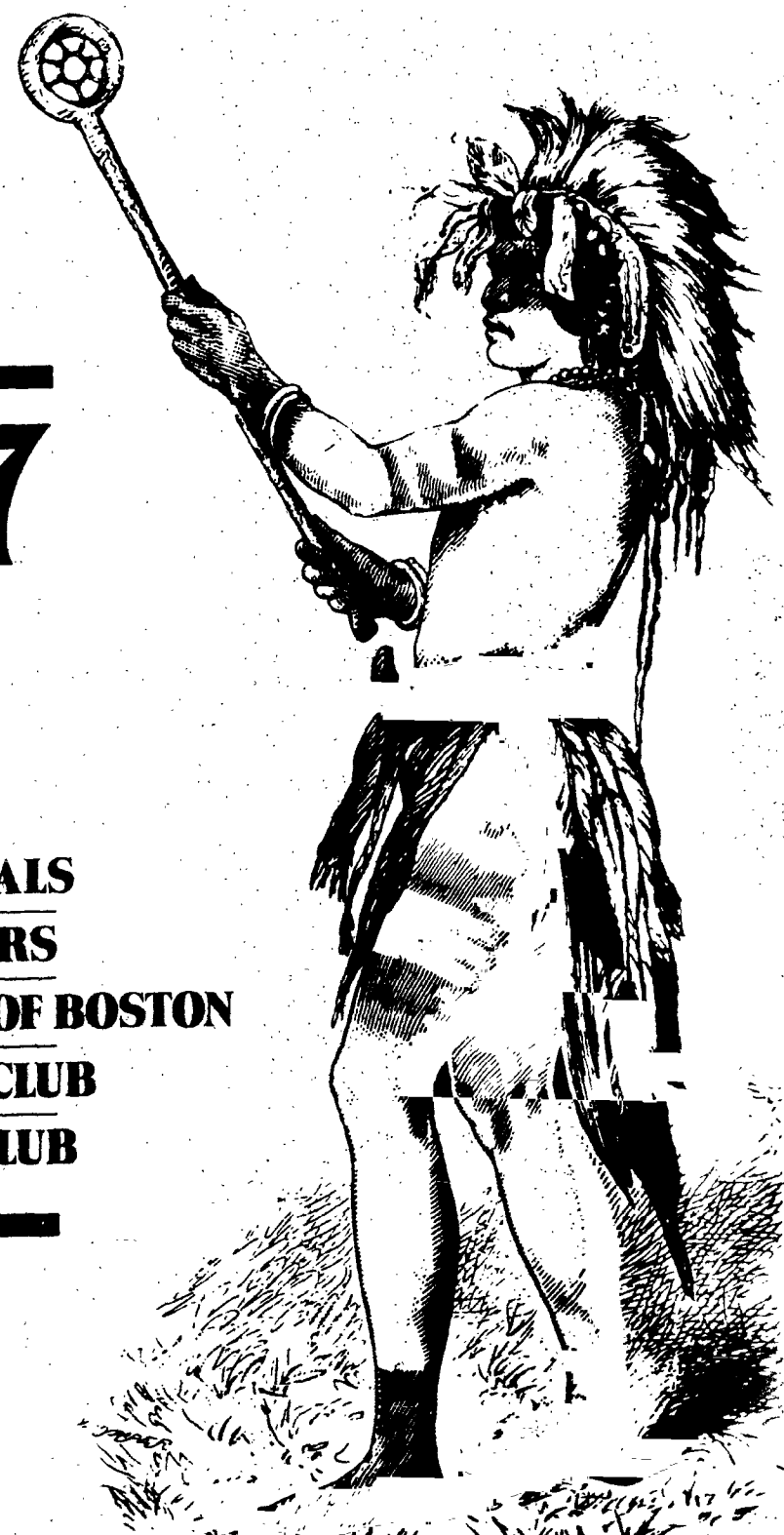
