

Free Professional Training Offered Word Processing (Full-Time) Mohawk Council of Akwesasne - Adult Education Program

Location: Akwesasne

Anticipated August 13, 1990. Start Date: (Pending final approval of government funding).

Admission Requirements: Completed 10 years of schooling, including English; Unemployed for 24 of the last 30 weeks; out of school for twelve months since turning 18 years of age. Also, basic typing skills (30 wpm) and ability to set up letters.

Working Conditions: Students will be trained to operate the various word processing systems that may be used in secretarial work. You will also learn how to exchange information with outside terminals and how to store data.

Application Deadline: July 6, 1990

Successful completion of training may lead to full-time employment.

This program offers you the possibility of receiving Federal training allowances which may also include babysitting expenses, etc.

CRAFTS FESTIVAL**

Albany, N.Y. - Iroquois craftspeople will demonstrate and sell their work at the Native American Crafts Festival slated for July 4 and 5 from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. at The New York State Museum. Admission is free. Fine crafts will be for sale, including baskets, beadwork, pottery, silverwork, jewelry, paintings, sculpture, clothing and handmade lacrosse sticks. Artisans will also demonstrate how they create silverwork, baskets, and silverwork. Traditional Native American foods, including fry bread, corn soup, corn bread and strawberry lemonade will be available for purchase.

**Acreage Reports
Due July 16,
1990**

"Farmers who have planted corn for the 1990 season are reminded that now is the time to report this crop," said county Executive Director of the Franklin County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, Bob McCarthy.

Crop reporting is necessary before the farmer can receive deficiency payments, price support loans and other farm program benefits. As of June 22nd, approximately 125 farmers in the county had reported their crops.

After certification, farms will be selected at random to verify that acreage reports are accurate. Aerial photographs are available for farmers to identify their fields. Farmers participating in this year's acreage reduction programs are required to report their corn and other acreages planted, the uses made of these crops, crop land area to be devoted to the acreage conservation reserve and acres diverted for payments. Growers not participating in the program should report their acreages to insure benefits and protect acreage bases.

Acreage reports may be filed Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. at the local ASCS office, West Main St. Rd., Malone. Franklin County producers are encouraged to certify crops as soon as possible.

**"Birds of Prey"
Live
Demonstration**

Albany, N.Y. - Wild life educator Bill Robinson will bring to the New York State Museum "Birds of Prey" in a live demonstrations on Saturdays, June 30 and July 21 at 1, 2 and 3 p.m. The majestic owl, falcon, and Indian condor with a 10-foot wingspan are among the birds featured in the presentations which explain the important roles of birds of prey in nature. Robinson holds a masters degree in biology and has appeared at the American Museum of Natural History and in television's Wild Kingdom, and schools and other educational institutions. He is founder and past president of the New York State Falcon Association. He is a director of the New Paltz Peregrine Falcon Foundation and the Raptor Rehabilitation and Research center. His articles on birds of prey and wildlife conservation have appeared in numerous publications. Admission to the live demonstrations is \$2 for adults, \$1 for children.

**MCME JOINT
VENTURE
OBSERVANCE**

Mohawk Construction Management Enterprise (MCME) has been involved in a joint venture with J.C. Cheek Sod & Erosion Contractor, Inc. from Mississippi. The joint venture has been performing a landscaping subcontract at the Fort Drum Light Infantry base in Watertown, New York. The construction of Fort Drum is the largest peacetime military construction project. The joint venture's subcontract through Black River Constructors, the general contractor, is the largest minority subcontract during construction. The subcontract's scope of work involves the planting of 7,000 trees, 40,000 shrubs and 200 acres of turfing.

On June 29, 1990 an observance will be held in Fort Drum to commemorate the planting of the last tree. Our joint venture partner will be inviting their congressman from Mississippi. MCME will be inviting legislators and representation from the BIA. MCME will be represented. The Tribal Council will be present. The joint venture is inviting General Boylan, Commander of the 10th Army Mountain Division; Col. Reth, Deputy Area Engineer of the New York Corps of Engineers; and Col. Webster, Garrison Commander. This tentative list plus other dignitaries will participate in the event starting at 1:00pm and conclude with a helicopter tour of the base.
