### Public Notice to Community

The Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples is seeking applications for employment from Aboriginal Students across Canada who will be employed in Ottawa from April 1st to September 1st, 1992.

The Directors of the Secretariat, Administration, Communications, Public Participation and Research will require a number of individuals who will provide general assistance on a number of existing and proposed projects relating to the Commission's mandate. To be eligible, applicants must be presently enrolled in a degree program and be returning to full time studies in the Fall Session. Remuneration will be at a rate of \$10.60 per hour. The cost of travel to and from Ottawa at the commencement and termination of the employment period will be borne by the Commission.

There will be a requirement for students with an interest and or experience in accounting, writing, computer systems, translation (particularly Aboriginal languages), desktop publishing, travel planning and logistics, marketing, policy analysis and general research.

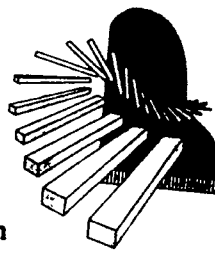

### Tribe Hosts Workshop For Preadolescent Teens

One great success leads to another. Or so it seems with the Tribe's Teen/Women Health Program.

The Teen/Women Health Program conducted a workshop in 1991 for pre teenage girls entitled "Your Changing Body." The focus of this workshop was to educate and inform pre teenage girls about the physical and emotional changes that naturally occur as they are developing during puberty.

Due to the success of this workshop, many requests have been received to hold a similar one for preadolescent boys aged 10 - 13 years.

The workshop will be held on Wednesday, April 15 from 1:30 - 4:00 p.m. in the Upstairs Classroom, Community Building, Hogansburg, N.Y. Although it is not necessary for a parent to attend with the preadolescent teen, fathers, and/or an adult friend of the child are welcome.

Co-presenters of the workshop will be Irving Papineau and Nancy Wolgemuth of the Tribe's Teen/Women Health Program. Ms. Wolgemuth can be contacted for more information on this workshop at (518) 358-3141.

The workshop will focus on the physical and emotional changes that naturally occur as they pertain to preadolescent boys. Physical changes can include rapid growth spurts, changing of voice and increased physical strength. Emotional changes can encompass feelings towards the opposite sex.

Children typically talk to each other about these topics and can, in many cases, be misinformed. They may also refrain from approaching their parents about these issues for any number of reasons. As well, the parents of these preadolescent teens may also be uncomfortable discussing this topic, hence the workshop.

A workshop type setting can become a comfortable, respectable and neutral setting for discussion of an uncomfortable topic. And the children will invariably leave the workshop with the "proper" information on what their bodies will be experiencing.
