General Vanier Vikings Lose Season Opener

A very wet rainy miserable field was a lousy host to General Vanier as they were defeated by St. Lawrence 13-5 in N.A.C. Lacrosse action.

The Cornwall team looked promising starting off with an end to end scoring play from Clayton Barnes 1:58 into the first quarter.

On this rush, G.V. goalie Benson Hopps went behind his net to send the ball down the field. His pass was intercepted by Matt Scharf of the Larries and he shot on Hopps. He made the save and gave it to Barnes who carried the ball down the length of the field. In front of the net, he found Kariwate Mitchell and fed him the pass and he scored.

St. Lawrence quickly tied it up on Mark Mahoneys goal one minute later with the assist going to Larries goalkeeper Andre Gardner. This play was just one example explained by S.L.C. coach Tim Hayes, that Gardner made them get in the game.

"He was the key to what was going on out there and he made things happen," he said.

St. Lawrence jumped ahead with two goals by Travis Philips. His first came with 1:11 left in the quarter unassisted and his second with :15 seconds left. He would later score two more for an afternoon total of four.

The Larries ended the first quarter 3-1.

In the second quarter, Mark Snelgrove took over in the Vikings net. Only two goals were scored: Mark Mahoney scored his second goal with Philips assisting. G.V. countered on Kariwate Mitchells' goal with 1:55 left on the clock. He intercepted a loose Larries ball and stuffed it home.

While Andre Gardner was in the St. Lawrence goal the whole game, the Vikings alternated with Benson Hopps and Mark Snelgrove.

In the third quarter, Philips made it 5-2 as he got the pass from Terry Francis who was parked behind the net of Hopps.

Terry Turcotte of the Vikings scored at 2:23 as he and Clayton Barnes put on a fine passing display.

One minute later Terry Francis of St. Lawrence scored as he rushed the net, slipping by the General Vanier defence. His goal was unassisted.

Travis Baxter scored at 3:29 and the Larries held a 7-3 lead. His goal was unassisted.

The visiting Vikings got one goal back with exactly four minutes left in the third quarter. While the ball was in the Larries crease and the players piled up trying to get possession, Brandon David came out of nowhere and stuffed it in.

Matt Scharf of St. Lawrence scored unassisted :21 seconds later

and Ryan Kilger got one on the Cornwall teams scoresheet. His goal was unassisted as he and several of his team mates crashed the net.

Rushing the net like this was not one of the pre-game instructions from Vaniers coach Louie Mitchell.

"Don't rush the net, said Mitchell,"take your time and pass."

Matt Scharf scored his second of the game at the nine minute mark but was the recipient of a Vikings hit after the play.

In the final quarter the Larries went to work and put the game out of reach.

They scored four goals in an eight minute span to cap the 13-5 win.

In that span Jeff Château scored two goals while the others went to Travis Philips picked up his fourth goal of the game and Terry Francis his second.

Coaches Louie Mitchell and Tim Hayes both agreed that the General Vanier loss was due to inexperience.

The field behind G.V.S.S. is still wet and cannot be used. The April 23rd game against Salmon River has been rescheduled.

For the time being the team is holding their practices on the tennis courts adjacent to the school.

This was one factor that decided this game, as noted by coach

Mitchell.

"This was our first game, first time of a field and it showed" says Mitchell. "We can't do any plays. I think it will take about three more games before we get it."

Hayes gave credit to the Vikings in their effort to adapt to the field and he also complimented Mitchell on maturing his team from last year.

"They were much more controlled, Louie did a good job from last year." He also made note about G.V.s practicing on concrete in their style of play.

"They were trying a lot of one handed scoops, and that is very hard on this field."

He added,"This is our third game in three days, this is their (G.V.S.S.) first game. They are in the same position that we were in last Tuesday."

Hayes also made light of the player difference: 26 on the G.V. squad and 18 on the Larries.

"We kid around that the more they have at G.V., the less they will have at Salmon River," explained Hayes.

Louie Mitchell recognized the problems of running a team with that many players in that he can't play everybody because it's too difficult.

The rescheduled Salmon River game is at SRC on Thursday April 23 at 3:15p.m.

Whats Happening at CKON 97.3FM

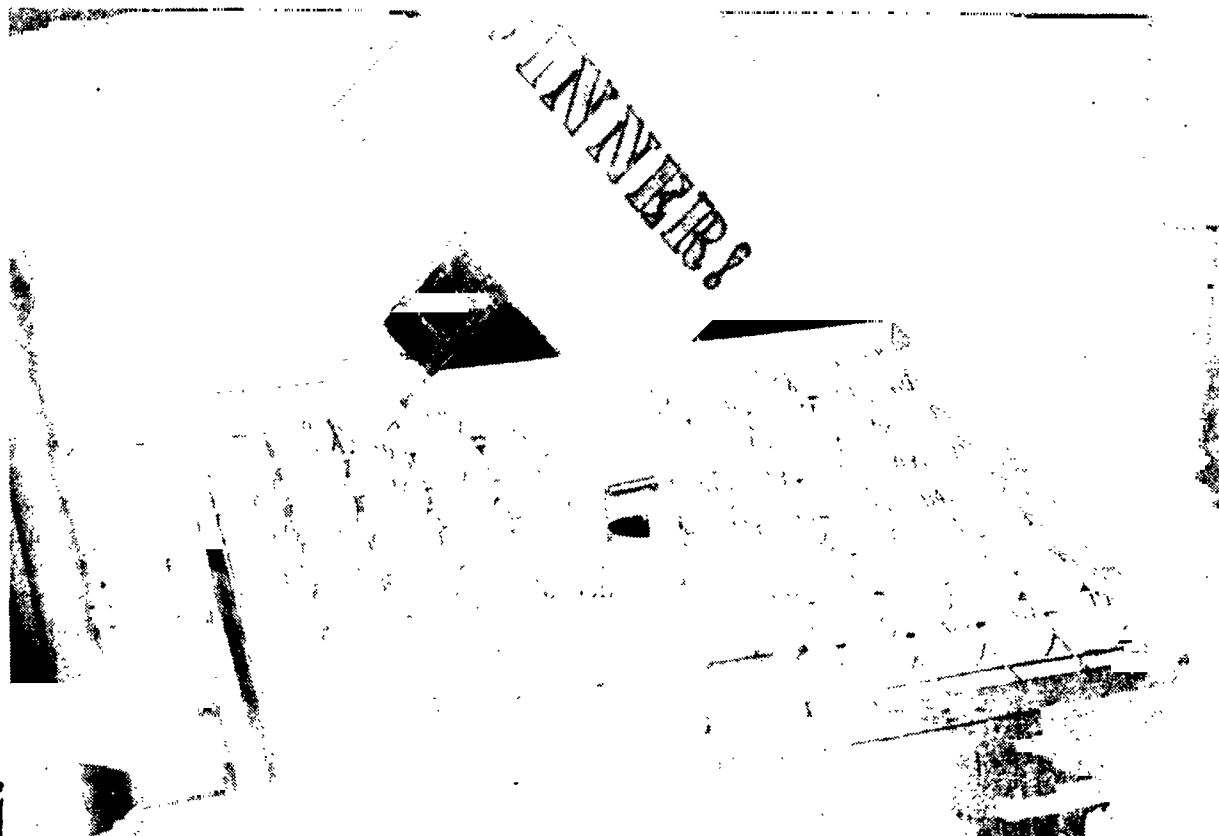

CKON is entering its eighth year on the air. In that time the format has undergone many changes, the most important being on the air 24 hours. In its infancy in 1984 CKON stayed on the air until 12:00 a.m. Now when the last person leaves the air at night, he/she turns on the Compact Disc Carousel. The carousel is capable of holding up to five compact discs and can play them in random order. The carousel is operations until 6:00 a.m. during the week and until 8:00 a.m. on weekends.

One of the mainstream programs on CKON has been Saturday nights "State of Rock" with Bill Henry. He features the latest in Heavy Metal and Hard Rock mixed in with interviews and other features. In addition to the "State of Rock", Bill Henry also does the morning Country music shift during the week. On Sunday nights Nick does the "Roots of Rock" show, comprised mainly of blues and rock classics.

During the week programming starts with Billy Henry's morning show from 6:00 a.m. until 10:00 a.m. when Donnie "Country Sparrow" Sharrow comes aboard with his "Big Country" show until 12:00 p.m.

For the noon hour show, Ron Lafrance Jr. does crossover county as well as specialty programming, such as interviews and issues of concern to the community.

At 1:00 p.m. The Sparrow returns with "Rock Pile", a look at classic tunes mixed in with some blues and occasional adult contemporary.

From 3:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Rene comes in with her show. She features the "Power Hour" during which the request lines are opened and all your requested tunes and dedications are played.

During the weekday evenings, Bonnie and Nick alternate. Bonnie takes your requests and plays her favorites, interviews with local bands are frequent features. Last month Aldo Nova was in the booth. Donnie plays the blues and classic rock.

On Sunday afternoons Rene and Bonnie co-host a program called "Short Set Sunday." During this time, contests are held where Rene and Bonnie ask: questions and if the correct caller gets it right, he or she is entitled to program up to three of their favorite songs. This impromptu program was a mutual affair between Rene and Bonnie.

"We just did it," explains Rene, "People liked it and it caught on." Daily giveaways are part of the stations programming. CKON will be giving away tickets to the upcoming Monster Truck Show at the Cornwall Civic Complex. In the past CKON has given away tickets to the Cornwall Royals hockey games and WWF Wrestling. CKON has entered into a deal with the Subway in Cornwall where a one foot submarine sandwich is given away every weekday morning at 11:00 a.m. and a three foot party sub is given away every Friday night at 9:30 p.m.

On Tuesday April 21 Mohawk Nation Radio continues its radio bingo tradition. In the past the bingo has been held on Thursdays, but a survey concluded that too many things will be conflicting with the bingo so it was moved to Tuesday nights at 7:00p.m.

For those not aware of the set up of the studios of CKON the studio, it is divided up into three portions: production, interview studio and broadcast booth, with a window separating them.

For the games, the bingo machine and balls are in the middle

interview studio and when the numbers are drawn they are held up to the glass. The announcer will say the English version and the Mohawk version of the number.

In the last season of radio bingo, some recipients for the 50/50 game were the family of Gerald George, Students of General Vanier, St. Regis Drug and Alcohol Divisions Adolescents Social Group, the Akwesasne Old Sticks League, Family Support for the Mentally and Physically Challenged.

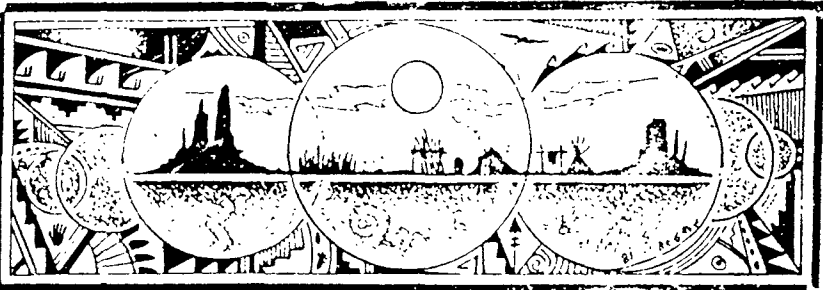
For the first game on April 21 the money goes to the CKON Radio Bingo fund. This will be for cards, prize money and other expenses.

Various staff members will be on hand to operate the bingo. Donnie Sharrow and Ron Lafrance Jr. will alternate announcing every week. The phones will be answered by Bonnie, Rene and the Bluebeard. On March 16 the local phone lines were changed and the "1" plus the area code and 7 digit number have to be used. This will not effect radio bingo because the station is equipped with both American and Canadian phone lines.

Bill Henry is one of the D.J.'s who is looking forward to bingo starting up. "It's a good idea" he says," its nice to get the community involved with us."

Randy Jock-Reidy, CKON Sales Manager, says the bingo program returned because of that same community involvement. "A lot of people asked about it (bingo) and I'm looking forward to it," he says.

Timothy Thompson, Station Manager agrees in saying, "I'm g'ad to see that radio bingo is coming back because it's mainly the community who have been asking for it."
