## Indigenous Peoples Conference Coming to Edmonton

A historical conference promoting addiction free lifestyles, scheduled for Edmonton this summer, is expected to attract more than 3500 indigenous people from around the world. The conference, "Healing Our Spirit Worldwide" will run for five days, July 7 to 11, 1992, at the Convention Center. It will focus on the healing movement indigenous peoples have undertaken to rebuild families, communities, and nations long devastated by the tragic effects of alcohol and drug abuse. In addition, there will be live theater, arts and crafts sales and special healing sessions.

Conference organizer Kim Ghostkeeper says the agenda will feature a wide range of subjects including how families heal, family violence and the effects of cultural genocide. "A call for presentations at this conference brought an overwhelming response," Ghostkeeper says. "The submissions are indicative of the quality programs delivered worldwide by Indigenous Peoples in the addictions field." The conference will also feature a youth component which is expected to draw better than 300 young people between the ages of 13 and 24. "The youth committee developing 'The Healing Generation In Action', for their peers," explains Rod Jeffries, co-organizer of the conference. "The name itself really is representative of the commitment of Indigenous young people to the future...not just their own personal futures, but the future of the world. They'll be looking at issues like alcohol and drugs in the 90's, suicide prevention, environmental issues, sexuality and the future as it relates to aboriginal youth."

The conference will open with a spectacular ceremony at the Poundmaker/Nechi Center in St. Albert, on July 7th. An evening of song and dance from international indigenous groups as well as cultural entertainers from across Canada will culminate with a First Nations feast, with traditional aboriginal foods from

around the world. This first ever celebration is jointly hosted by the National Native Association Of Treatment Directors in Calgary, Nechi Institute On Alcohol and Drug Education, Edmonton and the National Association For Native American Children Of Alcoholics, Seattle, Washington. ## Purple Passion

This punch is proportioned for 70. It is an open house must.  
1 46 - ounce can of pineapple juice  
1 46 - ounce can apricot nectar  
1 quart orange juice  
2 quarts orange sherbet  
2 pints vanilla ice cream  
1 10 - ounce package frozen strawberries, thawed  
2 quarts ginger ale, chilled  
Garnish: Pineapple cubes, mini springs, and whole strawberries  
Combine all the fruit juices in a large punch bowl. Beat the sherbet and ice cream in with a whisk, leaving them in small chunks. Add the strawberries. Gently stir in the ginger ale and place a large piece of ice, or an ice ring, in the bowl. Add garnish (enough so that your guests will scoop up a bit with each serving).

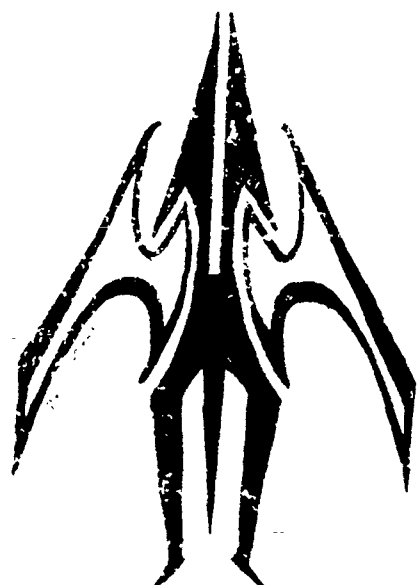
