Akwesasne Business Community and Banking Industry Sponsor Seminar for Entrepreneurs

To support and encourage sustained economic development in First Nations communities, Akwesasne business leaders, Canada's major domestic banks and the Canadian Bankers Association (CBA) jointly developed and organized a small business seminar.

The seminar will be held on Thursday, April 27, from 9:00 am to 3:30 pm, at the Kawenoke Community Centre on Cornwall Island. The registration fee is \$20 and

Here's the morning's agenda:

Panel 1: Financial Providers: Potential sources of capital for Aboriginal businesses: Representatives from Ohwistha Capital Corp., SOAR Development Corp., Canada's chartered banks, Aboriginal Business Canada, and the Federal Business Development Bank talk about products and services available to small business entrepreneurs.

Panel 2: The Indian Act: Focus will be on how the Indian Act impacts lending to on reserve businesses. Regulations and guidelines governing G.S.T. and implications for Revenue

Canada will also be discussed.

Panel 3: Federal and Ontario government loan programs: Federal and provincial government representatives discuss their on reserve loan programs. For example, lending under the Small Business Loans Act and Ontario's Aboriginal Ventures Program.

The luncheon speaker will be a successful small business entrepreneur from Tyendingaga, Mr. Jim McMurter, who runs a home building supply company.

In the afternoon, seminar participants will review and discuss case studies that are based on real-life situations. Bankers and other small business financing experts will help guide the discus-

sions. Afterwards, they will be available to answer any questions seminar participants might have about financing their own small business.
