False Rumor About Tri-Town Folding

According to owner, Peter Burns, the Tri-town Warriors Senior B Lacrosse Team has not folded and will not fold. The rumors have been flying around in Akwesasne for over a week about the Tri-town Warriors folding or merging with the Long Sault Outlaws. "Not True", said Pete Burns in an interview on Wednesday, April 19, 1995. Pete went on to say that his team would not fold when Tri-town was a contender last season.

If lacrosse fans remember, Tri-town gave the Thunder a hard time in the playoffs of the '94 season. Pete went on to say that, "the team has an arena to play out of and a team to put on the floor."

Tri-town started practic-

ing last week and will be practicing four days this week and next. If there are any players who want to play lacrosse then they should come out. "If you think you're a lacrosse player," said Pete, "then come on out." Players are welcome to come to the Tri-town practices.

"It's every team's dream to win the President's Cup and I have six teams to run over and these teams are tough," Pete went on to say. This is a brand new year for Senior B Lacrosse in Akwesasne. Last year there was one team from Akwesasne, still is, but there are two teams that have entered the Iroquois Lacrosse League and will have Akwesasne men on their teams.

The Fay brothers, Bill Bascum and Thomas Ryan from Boston College are just a few of the Tri-town players returning along with local Mohawk Lacrosse players. The Iroquois lacrosse league teams must have their final rosters into the executive office by April 22nd. "April 15th, the teams had to submit their protected list of players, 15 runners and 2 goalies", Pete stated. Once the protected lists are circulated, the trading begins. Pete went on to say that he hopes to sign 59 players for the season...just like last year.

Tri-town's season opener is on Sunday, May 7, 1995, 8:00 p.m. at the Tri-town Arena.
