Summer Camp Opportunities Available To Girls

Free camp brochures are available at Tri Lakes Day Camp and Lake Clear Resident Camp. Both camps are operated by the North Country Girl Scout Council in accordance with local, state, and Girls Scouts of the U.S.A.'s Health Regulations and Standards. Non-Girl Scouts may attend all camp programs. Limited financial assistance is available.

Lake Clear Resident Camp is located minutes Northeast of Saranac Lake. Many programs offer activities such as horseback riding, sailing, canoeing, sports, space exploration, and a new low-element ropes course. A four-day mini-session is also offered for first-time campers. All programs include swimming, arts and crafts, songs and games, nature hikes, outdoors cooking, and campfires.

Four weekly sessions, beginning July 7, are offered at Lake Clear Resident Camp to girls entering second through twelfth grades. Resident camp sessions begin Sunday afternoon and end Friday evening. Resident camp fees range from \$120 to \$220 depending on program selection.

Two weekly sessions are offered at Tri Lakes Day Camp at Lake Clear Camp. One session offers an optional overnight, and Day Camp fees range from \$70 to \$75. All day camp programs offer swimming, arts and crafts, special activities, campfires, singing and dancing.

Open House will be held at Lake Clear Camp Sunday, May 12, beginning at 1:00 pm and ending at 3:00 pm. Please contact the North Country Girl Scout Council on the Tom Miller Road in Plattsburgh at 563-1560 to receive directions and a free brochure.

Treaty of Canandaigua 200th Anniversary Photo Exhibit

Anne Schein has produced the exhibit as a result of her interest in the Haudenosaunee. The exhibit is travelling across the Six Nations' territory at Ms. Schein's expense. From all accounts, she has done an exceptional job of presenting this historic event.
