Post Secondary Programs

Iohahio Akwesasne Adult Education is currently taking applications for the following post-secondary programs:

- **Entry Level Computer Program** - This summer program will allow successful participants to apply for entry-level positions in the community and supplement the learning they have. This eight-week full-time program will also act as a feeder to allow participants into the Computer Networking & Technical Support program scheduled for September 2000.

- **Computer Networking & Technical Support** - This two-year program will allow students to receive hands-on training in programming, operating systems, networking, database concepts, systems analysis and Internet

- **Hospitality Services** - Graduates of this two-semester program will acquire the skills and knowledge to perform duties in a variety of hospitality settings. This program is "hands on" with practical skills reinforced in a dining room/kitchen restaurant facility. A job placement component is included in the second semester.

Applications may be picked up at Iohahio in Tsisnaihne. A copy of all high school and college transcripts will be required. An interview process is conducted before final selection of students for the programs.

Deadline for applications for all of these programs is Monday, June 5, 2000.

A spirometry test is a form of pulmonary function test done to determine evidence or extent of lung disease.

If you have an existing lung disease such as asthma, COPD, emphysema or chronic bronchitis, you may be interested in this clinic.

For individuals wishing to take advantage of this free testing, Dr. Brian Young will read the tests and give his interpretation.
