Uncle Sam paid close attention to the recital, at the close of which the Goddess of Liberty demanded of him what he was going to do about it? Uncle Sam made answer by calling his soldiers, Boys of the Fifth and Sixth Grades. Henri complained of being ill and Uncle Sam called his nurses and stretcher bearers. He was hungry and a group of farmers appeared and housewives appeared. Petit Jean was cold and the knitters were summoned. The last three groups were farmers, Boys of Third and Fourth Grades; Housewives, the Girls of Third and Fourth Grades; Knitters, Girls of Second Grade.

The finale came with the declaration by Uncle Sam, "I have called, and they have answered. What are YOU going to do to win this war," he demanded of the audience.

NORMAL SERVICE FLAG.

Unfurled With Appropriate Exercises Friday.

The service flag of the Potsdam Normal was dedicated in the gymnasium at special exercises held last Friday afternoon. The flag contains 133 stars for Normal men in various branches of the service and one gold star for Harvey Clark, Normal student who lost his life with the British forces in Mesopotamia several months ago. The entire school was present at the exercises.

The program opened with the singing of the Battle Hymn of The Republic, after which the service flag was unfurled. Prof. L. D. Taggart made the presentation for the training school, Prof. E. W. Flagge for the Normal, and Dr. C. H. Leete, president of the board of trustees, made the acceptance for the school. The Star Spangled Banner was then sung. The school recited The American Creed, a salute to the flag was given and the singing of America closed the exercises.

A PROCLAMATION, issued jointly by the President of the United States and by the Governor of the State of New York.

FRIDAY, JUNE 28, 1918

Has Been Named as National War Savings Day

You are hereby instructed to appear on that day at the nearest school-house or other place locally designated, and enroll as a regular purchaser of War Saving Stamps. If you do not care to appear personally, you may be represented by the proxy of a pledge card previously signed. These pledges will be available during the week of June 22-28th.

War Saving Stamps can be paid for during any month in the year 1918, but it is intended that subscriptions will be signed for them by June 28th.

COST OF WAR SAVINGS STAMPS

During June, July and August, 1918

Table with 5 columns: Stamp quantity, Cost in June, Cost in July, Cost in August, and Value on Jan 1, 1923. Rows include 1 Stamp (\$4.17), 20 Stamps (\$83.40), 50 Stamps (\$208.50), 100 Stamps (\$417.00), and 200 Stamps (\$834.00).

The law provides that no person can hold in his or her own name War Saving Stamps exceeding \$1,000 maturity value, but they may be purchased for other members of the family, including minor children.

The money invested in War Savings Stamps is not a gift, or a donation, but is a loan to the Government. It will all be paid back with 4% interest compounded quarterly. If, because of some serious financial reverse, or calamity, it should be necessary to get your money before January 1, 1923, you may do so by giving ten days' notice to any Money Order postmaster, in which case you can get what you paid for the stamps with interest to date of payment.

The Government of the United States expects all citizens to pledge themselves to save and economize to help win the war. Do not forget the last day for signing your pledge—JUNE 28th. On that date you must appear at the polling place either in person or by proxy of your pledge card.
