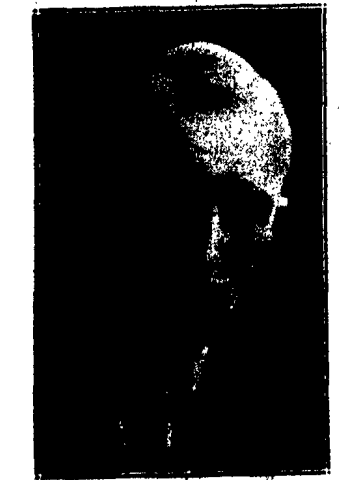


### HINMAN TAKES POSTOFFICE POSITION

### DULLEA WINS APPEAL.

Judgment Secured by Gallagher and Lalone Is Reversed.

The Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, Third Department, by a recent decision has reversed the judgment which Patrick E. Gallagher and Frederick J. Lalone of Potsdam, recovered against Charles Dullea also of this village, at the Trial Term of the Supreme Court, held at Canton, in January, 1921, for \$10,235, as commissions for the sale of Dullea's farm to John H. Sweeney.

Dullea took an appeal from the judgment to the Appellate Division. William H. McCormick of Potsdam represented Dullea and George W. Fuller of Potsdam represented Gallagher and Lalone.

### DEMOCRAT WILL SUCCEED FULLER

FEDERAL JUDGE COOPER TO NAME NEW REFEREE IN BANKRUPTCY.

It is expected that a referee in bankruptcy to succeed George W. Fuller of this village will be named shortly. Mr. Fuller's term expired in November. Appointment of his successor is in the hands of Federal Judge Cooper. Judge Cooper is a Democrat and a Democrat will undoubtedly be named to succeed Mr. Fuller.

For nearly a quarter of a century, the office was located in Ogdensburg, John C. Tulloch holding down the place for over 20 years. He was succeeded by Roscoe C. Sanford, who held the place for one term. At the time of the naming of Mr. Sanford considerable feeling was engendered on the part of the friends of John C. Tulloch as he was a candidate for the place, and it was not known that Sanford aspired to the office. No sooner had Mr. Sanford taken over the office than a movement was started to make him a one-term man. How well the trick was done was manifested when George W. Fuller of Potsdam succeeded Mr. Sanford, being named to the place by Federal Judge Ray.

When Judge Cooper was named to the Federal bench by President Wilson there was rejoicing in the ranks of Democratic attorneys of Northern New York as they saw the end of the Republican being handed down the luscious plum of referee in bankruptcy to their fellow Republicans, and it now looks as though they will come into their own again and hold it for a good long time. Some years ago the office of referee in bankruptcy is worth several thousand dollars, depending upon the number of bankruptcy cases in the county.

### SENTENCED FOR "LOITERING"

A special despatch to the Syracuse Journal from Little Falls, December 29 says:

"An appeal from the sentence of 180 days in the Onondaga County Penitentiary by Judge Collins of police court, has been filed in county court by counsel for Charles Albino, also Charles Ponso and Merritt Emory of Syracuse.

The case will be argued on appeal before Judge Bell of Herkimer. Albino and Emory were arrested here on charges of intoxication and loitering around suspicious places. They pleaded guilty and received the sentence from Judge Collins.

In the appeal the men declared that they were not guilty of intoxication and that they pleaded guilty because Chief of Police Long told them that they would let them leave the city. The two came to the city in an auto with George Conrad, Conrad's auto is still being held here. He was not arrested at the time.

### NO CHANGE IN SODA PRICE.

Tax Repeal Will Bring Down Soft Drinks, However.

The repeal of the federal taxes on soft drinks effective January 1st will not effect the prices of sodas in Potsdam, it was said today by local dealers. It will result in a reduction of the prices on some drinks, however. Coca-cola, root beer, and kindred beverages will drop to five cents per glass. Ice cream will be ten cents per dish, once more, providing it is not of the sundae type, with syrup. Ice cream cones will be a nickel.

Dealers say that while the tax on soft drinks has been repealed, the government has, at the same time, imposed a tax on syrups which go into the making of sodas and sodas. They are unable, therefore, to cut the price on sodas which will remain at fifteen cents.

### FIND DAUGHTER OF WRITER IN ASYLUM

MRS. JESSAMY STEELE, THE DAUGHTER OF BRET HARTE

An inmate of the Ogdensburg State Hospital at Ogdensburg has been identified as Mrs. Jessamy Harte Steele, a daughter of Bret Harte, the author.

As a result, friends and admirers of the letters works are interesting themselves in her case and an effort will be made to have her transferred to a private sanitarium.

The showing of a motion picture of Bret Harte's "Tennessee Partner," led to the identification of the former Jessamy Harte who has been committed under her married name. No one at the asylum knew her as the author's daughter. At a recent holiday entertainment at the institution, during the showing of a film based on "Tennessee Partner," she was identified as Mrs. Harte, "My father's My father."

Removed by attendants from the assembly hall as disorderly, she demanded a lawsuit be brought against the producers of the film so that she would receive royalties on the picture. Little credence was given by her statements at the time, but her subsequent investigation revealed her identity disclosed by the temporary lifting of her mental fog.

Of the four daughters of Bret Harte, who died in England in 1902, Jessamy was the favorite of her father, and for years his sole companion after his separation from her mother. Jessamy Harte married Harry Milford Steele, a New York publisher. In 1899, but they were divorced in the early '90s. In 1915, it was learned she was committed to the psychopathic ward at Bellevue Hospital as Mrs. Steele.
