Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Seaver and family visited Mr. and Mrs. Delbert Christie at Wannakena last Thursday.

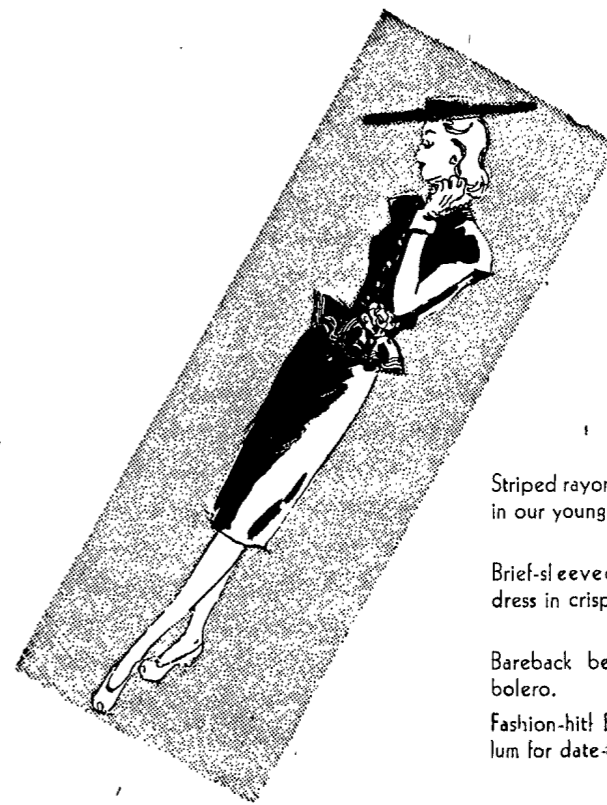

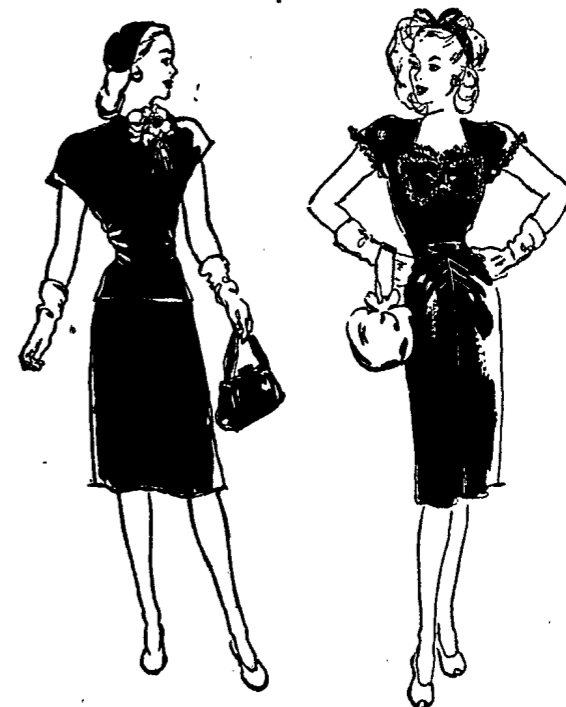
