

Blaze Guts Home Near Southville

Southville — Fire started by an overheated stove pipe gutted a small house at the corner of the Hopkinton and Parishville roads at Southville Thursday evening shortly after 8 p. m. The Clarence Shatraw family was about to vacate the house and the blaze destroyed packed furniture and clothing.

Martin Sullivan, chief of the Potsdam volunteers, and two assistant chiefs, Lester K. Speer and Bernard W. St. Dennis, dashed for Southville from the meeting of the St. Lawrence County Fire Association at the Albion Hotel which was in session when the alarm blew.

Well underway by the time the Potsdam pumper arrived, the fire

had charred the upper story of the frame house. The lower story was saved, although furniture there was damaged by smoke and water.

Mr. Shatraw, recently called into the service, and his family had been moving belongings out of the house during the day. They were not in the building when the fire occurred. They had left a stove burning and, according to firemen, the pipe overheated, igniting the flooring. The fire was discovered by a neighbor.
