

CAP Completes Defense Plans

Organization of a mobile support unit by the Potsdam flight of the Civil Air Patrol has been completed. For use in case of attack and in line of defense, the unit is staffed by 22 men, manning two planes. Equipment inventory includes a jeep, an ambulance, three trucks, a line truck, three two-way radio sets and a radio set for ground-air communication.

Lieut. F. C. Lyle is in charge of the transportation section, assisted by First Sgt. M. Lindsey and Lieut. C. E. Hall, drivers. E. Crossett is officer in charge of maintenance. He is aided by C. Ballerini, chief mechanic.

Officer in charge of search and rescue is S/Sgt. R. Cornish. His aids are Cadets P. Hamel, J. Tennant, R. Williams and W. Hutchinson.

Pakistani Enrolls As Tech Frosh

Amir Ahmad, a Pakistani citizen, enrolled at the Malone Branch of Clarkson College this week, Frederick A. Ramsdell, director of admissions, revealed today. His enrollment brings to eight the number of foreign countries represented on the college's two campuses.

Ahmad came to the United States aboard the Mauritania via England. He arrived in Potsdam 10 days ago to arrange for his studies here. The recipient of a scholarship through the Punjab Post-War Service Reconstruction Fund, he plans to study mechanical engineering.

The 26-year-old Pakistani holds a faculty of arts degree from the government college and the bachelor of arts degree from Islamia College. Both schools are located in his hometown of Lahore, Punjab.

After receiving his B. A. degree, Mr. Ahmad joined the Royal Indian Navy and during World War 2 served as a chief petty officer, schoolmaster. He taught English, mathematics and physics. He was a naval reservist and served in the Royal Pakistani Navy.

Mr. Ahmad's father, Muhammad Amir, is a government employee under the deputy commissioner of the District Soldiers Board in Lahore. His grandfather, Rissalder Jumna Khan, served in the 9th Bengal Lancers and participated in the Indian Mutiny, the Egyptian War and many other military campaigns. He spent more than 34 years in the military service.
