For the year, the cumulative total circulation was 38,631 volumes. The juvenile circulation was 9486.

A considerable number of books are available with the projector. Mrs. Buck pointed out that the new machine can be used by convalescents or persons confined by heart conditions, among others.

Through purchases and gifts, the library added 708 books to its shelves during the year 1950. Also begun last year was an alcove for high school-age readers, stocked with books catering to the interests of that group. The alcove has proved popular, Mrs. Buck stated.





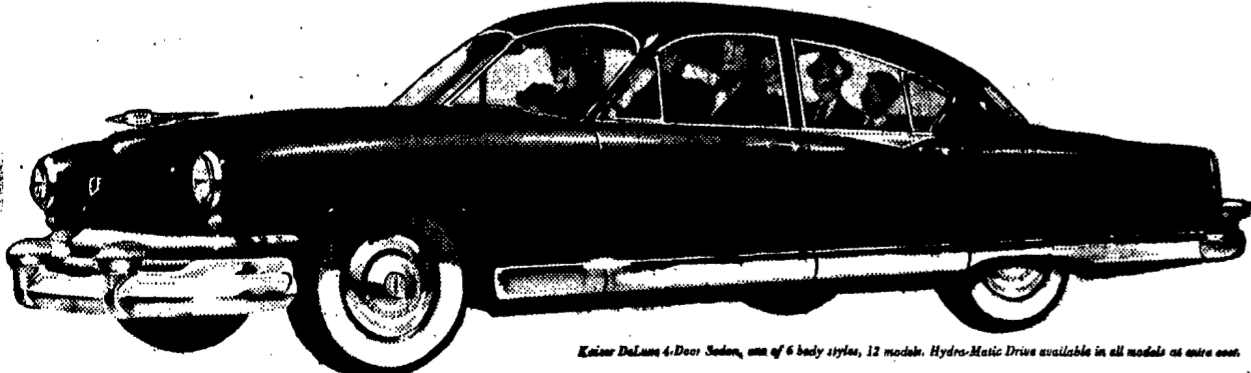
