

Cyrus Family Boasts 6 Soldiers; 2 in Uniform, 3 Vets, 1 Killed

Pfc. Ronald Cyrus, recently sent to Tampa, Fla., on Air Force duty is the sixth son of Mr. and Mrs. Neil Cyrus, RD 2, to have served in the U. S. armed forces. Another brother is still in uniform, one was killed in action during World War 2 and three others are veterans of that war.

Ronald Cyrus enlisted June 2, 1950 for four years. He trained at San Antonio, Tex. and F. E. Warren Air Force Base in Wyoming, where he became a powerman. He is 18 years old.

Pfc. William Cyrus, 20, enlisted in the Army on a three-year hitch in August, 1948. Now stationed in the military police, at Oakland, Calif., he was married to Miss Patricia Depaw of Potsdam in March, 1949.

Mr. and Mrs. Cyrus' oldest son, Wayne, was killed in September, 1944 at Aachen, Germany.

The three veterans are James, a World War 2 paratrooper; Merle, who lives in Ogdensburg, and army engineer in Germany during the second war, and Neil Jr., better known as Jack, who served for four years as a radar sergeant in Japan and Greenland during the war.

The Cyrus family includes six other children living at home. They are Margaret, Richard, Larry, Lee and the twins, Linda and Leon.

Mrs. Neil Cyrus is the former Miss Doris Nichols. Her husband is the son of Mrs. Zoe Rockwood Cyrus and the late Charles Cyrus.

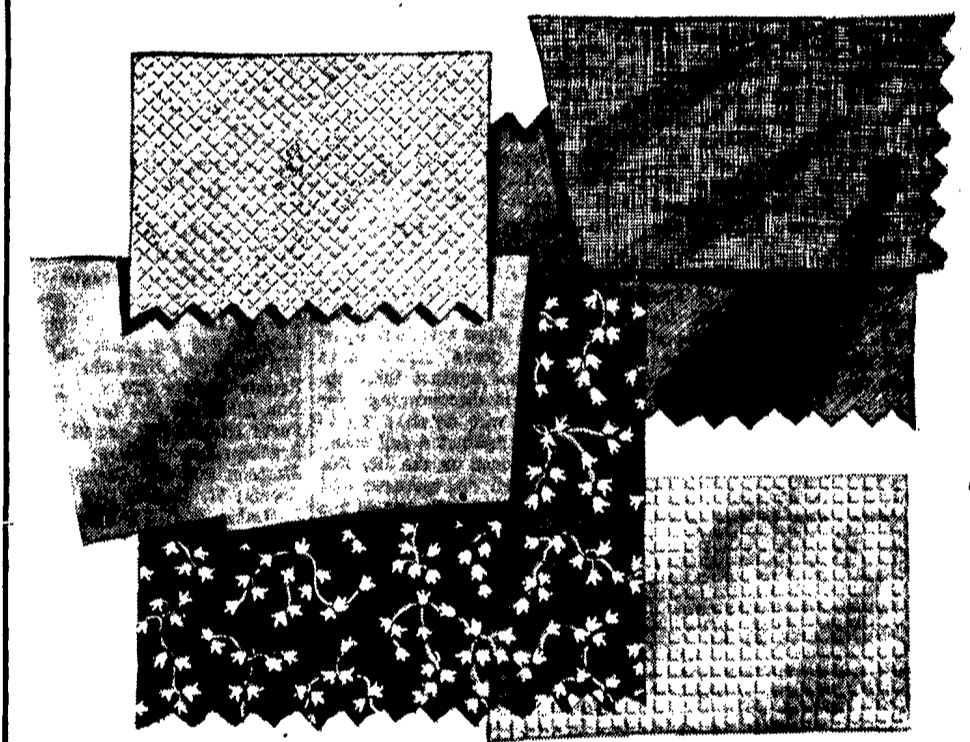
