With the score tied at 58-all at the end of the regulation time, Wells and Samuels of Champlain contributed two foul points and a field goal apiece to give their team the victory. High scorer was Wells with 20 points, Samuels followed with 18. High men for Potsdam were Ken VanOrman and Basil Burnham with 17 and 15 points respectively.

Champlain held a 19-15 edge at the end of the first quarter, roaring to a 39-22 lead at the half. In the third quarter Coach Sam Molnar's men came through with 17 points to trail by only 45-39 at the end of the third quarter.

After fighting a close game for two periods the Clarkson puck-chaser, surged ahead in the final third to overpower RPI 9-2. Troy Tuesday night. The victor, assured the Engineers of at least a tie for first place in the Tri-State League.

Sophomore Stan Moore opened the scoring for Tech at 1:06 of the first period, and paced the team all the way, scoring five goals. Wing Bill Drummond registered two points for OCT.

Later in the first period Reuschler caught Clarkson with two players in the penalty box, and evened the score with a goal by Don Shildneck at 8:24. Six minutes later RPI, taking advantage of another Clarkson penalty, slipped ahead, 2-1. Captain Tom Bellaty scored on a pass from Dick Whitcomb.

Until almost the end of the period, Poly outplayed the Engineers in all departments. Finally, at 19:49 Moore slipped a feather pass to Bill Munro. Munro flipped the puck past Goalee Ray Weinzler, giving the Golden Knights a lead which was never overtaken.

In the second period, two quick scores by Moore and Drummond put Clarkson out in front 4-2. Moore opened the five-goal assault in the final canto, scoring at 8:35. White followed with a goal at 9:31, and three final tallies were registered in the final minutes of play.

The victory was the eighth in nine attempts for the Technmen, who handed RPI its seventh setback of the season.
