IN MEMORIAM

Daniel William Charters became a member of the Potsdam Fire Department on April 4, 1922, assigned to the Hook and Ladder Company. Various Company and Department offices were the proving ground of his ability and, on April 5, 1933, his comrades elected him Chief of Department, the highest honor within their power to bestow. Retiring from office he continued as an active member of the Department and, at the time of his passing, had completed thirty years of continuous service.

Chief Charters was a zealous worker and a loyal fireman, whose devotion to duty was ever an inspiration to his comrades. His steady influence and wise counsel will be sadly missed.

Ever unassuming, the least tribute we can pay him is to rededicate our lives to the service of our fellowmen, a duty which was so close to his heart.
