Penrose Promoted At Clarkson Tech

The promotion of Charles Penrose from assistant to associate professor was announced this week by Dr. William G. Van Note, president of Clarkson College.

Mr. Penrose became head librarian and assistant professor at the college in July 1948. Before that he served for two years as assistant librarian at Bethany College, Bethany, W. Va.

He is a native of Marietta, Ohio, and attended Marietta College from 1932 to 1935. Mr. Penrose attended the College of William and Mary at Williamsburg, Va., from 1936 to 1939, receiving a bachelor of arts degree in 1937 and a bachelor of laws degree in 1939.

Following four years of army service he attended the University of Michigan where he received the degree of bachelor of arts in library science in 1946.

The librarian is chairman of the library committee at Clarkson College, chairman of the engineering school libraries' committee of the Upper New York section of the American Society for Engineering Education. He also serves on the college and university committees of the New York State Library Association.

Mr. Penrose recently served as a member of a committee of the pure and applied science section of the Association of College and Reference Libraries to draw up a list of basic engineering periodicals.

He is a member of the bar of the States of Ohio and Virginia, the American Library Association, the college and university section of the Special Library Association, and Delta Upsilon fraternity.

While in the service from 1941 to 1945, Mr. Penrose served at Fort Stevens, Ore., and with the Persian Gulf Command at Teheran, Iran.

Professor Attends Meeting Of Physics Teachers

W. Lee Dorn, associate professor of physics at Clarkson College, is attending a four-day meeting of the American Association of Physics Teachers in Iowa City, Iowa.

The conference, which this year is being held in conjunction with the colloquium of college physicists at the State University of Iowa, began today and ends Saturday.
