

Indians Stay in 1st Place with Russell After Beating Norfolk

Potsdam's Indians and Russell's entry in the Western Division of the St. Lawrence Valley League remain on top of the heap with three wins in three starts. Potsdam beat Norfolk, 8-7, and Russell licked the Massena Alcoas 15-12 in Sunday games.

In the Massena-Russell tussle, Sleeman emerged the winning pitcher. Johnson was his battery mate.

Seven runs in the sixth inning capped the victory for Russell. Ferraro, first baseman for Russell, drove an inside the park home run in the big inning with two men on base. Ferraro's hit went along the first base line. Right fielder Hutch Vishovich made a diving catch attempt. The ball rolled to the fence. Steve Donahue was released by Bob Wilkens in the fifth. Batterymate was Sidney Conklin.

Winthrop-Basher had little trouble in defeating Waddington by the score 10-8. Billy Rochford, Holy Cross athlete, allowed Waddington but six hits while striking out 20 men. Demo, also of W-B, led the batters on a perfect day at the plate with five hits for five at bat. W-B scored their runs in the first, second and fifth innings.

The Norwood Firemen finally managed to enter the victory column by sending down Raymondville to defeat by the score of 9-2. Raymondville grabbed an early lead of two runs in the second inning, but Norwood came back in the third to grab the lead which they never relinquished. pies sole possession of first place. The biggest scoring inning was the seventh when North Lawrence scored five times and Fort Covington came back and scored seven runs. The Fort came from behind in the ninth inning to score two runs and victory.

North Lawrence got 17 hits while the Fort gathered 16. Homers were hit by Dugan of North Lawrence and Sciarino and L. Lata-lupe of Fort Covington.

Burke defeated unbeaten Constable, 5-0, behind the masterful pitching of Harry Mastin who faced only 28 batters in the whole contest. It was Burke's contest all the way with Constable unable to put forth any kind of a threat behind the pitching of Mastin and the errorless fielding of the Burke players. In the hitting department Elmer Legacy did the heavy hitting for Burke getting three for five including a triple and a double.

St. Regis Falls and Hogsburg had a tight contest with the Falls coming out on top, 3-2. St. Regis Falls outslugged the men from the reservation 12 to 6, but some sparkling fielding kept the score close. Joek of Hogsburg collected two for four while McFaul and Ploof led the Falls players.

Helena managed to enter the victory column by defeating Chateaugay 9-6. Helena outhit the players from Chateaugay collected eight hits while Helena got 17. To be eligible for entry all dogs must be purebred and over six months of age. They must be registered with the American Kennel Club or proof presented that they are eligible for same. All dogs must pass veterinary examination at the show.
