Seven Clarkson College men will attend six-week summer camp in the Ordnance Corps at Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md., while four others will attend summer camp in the Quartermaster Corps at Fort Lee, Va. Lt. Col. O. H. Robinson, professor of military science and tactics at Clarkson, outlined the program for these ROTC cadets this week.

In training at Aberdeen from June 24 to Aug. 1 will be Richard L. Dalphin, Charles G. Geick, Alan O. Jennings, Richard F. Linder, Charles G. McGinnis, John Stangeby and Frank A. Westbury.
