Frackenkopf 11 as Choral, Orchestra Works Published

Two choral works and an orchestral composition by Dr. Arthur Frackenkopf, professor of music at The State University College at Potsdam, have been published.

"Praise, O Praise Our God and King" for voices and piano, published by Edward B. Marks Music Corp. of New York City, is in two versions, one for mixed voices, and one for two-part treble voices.

"Marches of Peace" a setting of poem of Whittier for mixed chorus and brass ensemble, has been published by Shawnee Press, Inc. of Delaware Water Gap, Pa. This work was written by Dr. Frackenkopf, of the college's Crane department of music, for the chorus of Hempstead High School when he was the Ford Founda-

tion composer - in residence there in 1959-60. It has also been performed by the Philadelphia All-City Chorus and Brass Ensemble.

An orchestral work, "Air and Cakewalk," has been published by Sam Fox Publishing Company of New York City. The piece was originally written by Dr. Frackenkopf for a school orchestra in Kenmore, and has also been played in East Williston.

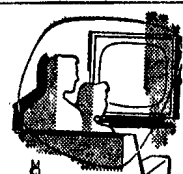
