CHRISTIAN SCIENCE: "SOUL AND BODY"
The availability here and now of the healing power of the Christ, Truth, will be stressed at Christian Science church services this Sunday.

Luke's account of the healing by Christ Jesus of the "woman which had a spirit of infirmity eighteen years, and was bowed together, and could in no wise lift up herself" is included in the Scriptural readings. "Soul and Body" is the subject of the lesson-sermon.

From "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy this passage will be read. "God will heal the sick through man, whenever man is governed by God. Truth casts out error now as surely as it did nineteen centuries ago. All of Truth is not understood; hence its healing power is not fully demonstrated" (p.495).
