
HOMEMADE POUND CAKE

1 1/2 cups sugar	1 cup shortening
2 1/2 teaspoons Davis Double Acting Baking Powder	1 teaspoon vanilla
1 teaspoon salt	4 eggs

Grease and flour a 9 or 10 inch angel cake pan. Sift together dry ingredients into a large mixing bowl. Add milk, shortening and vanilla; beat 2 minutes, scraping bowl frequently. Add unbeaten eggs and beat 2 minutes more. Pour into cake pan and bake in a 375°F. oven, 50-60 minutes.
