Personnel, Guidance Assn. Meeting Set At SUCP Tonight

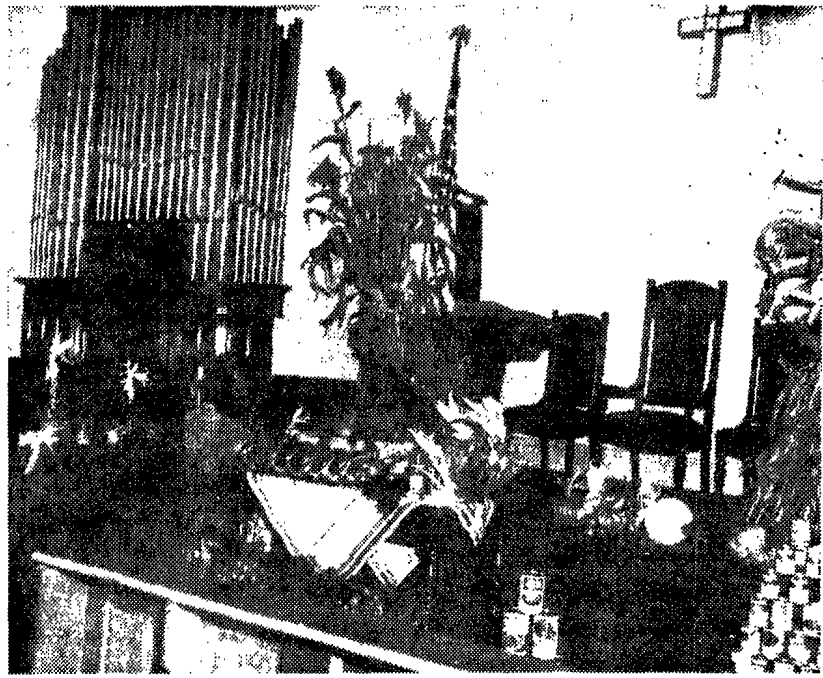
The Northern Zone Personnel and Guidance Association will hold a dinner meeting at 7 p. m. tonight in Thatcher Hall, SUCP.

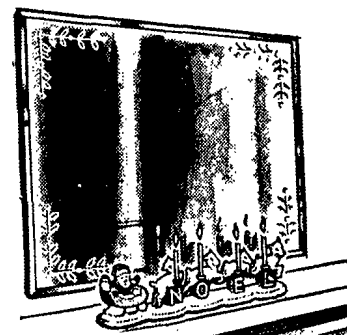
The State Department of Equalization and Assessment said that rates for the year 1961 will not be available in time to distribute taxes for the year of 1962.
