

Clarkson Matmen Trip Colgate

The wrestlers of Clarkson Tech began their 1961-62 season in high style here Saturday afternoon with a stunning 21-0 win over highly-regarded Colgate University at Alumni Memorial Gym.

With this victory, Coach Jack Hantz's grapplers established themselves firmly as one of the top contenders for small college honors in New York State this season. This was only the second time since 1953 that Clarkson had defeated Colgate in wrestling.

Four men from Massena made the difference here Saturday. These four former Massena High wrestling stars all came through in fine fashion, as from the beginning, it was evident that the Golden Knights were going to hold the upper hand. Joe Trimboli, who has now won nine matches in a row, decided his opponent 4-2 in the 123-lb. bout. Jim Gaika, the 133-lb. wrestler, was the same grappler who beat Trimboli last year in the Clarkson junior's only loss.

Colgate evened things up at 3-all when Mike DeMarras decided Howie Goldstein in the 133-lb. first appearance. Then came the bout of the afternoon. Making his first start for Clarkson, Massena's Ed Pay, considered one of the top high school wrestlers in the East two years ago, made short work of Steve Frycki in spectacular fashion, pinning the Colgate matman at 2:54 of the first period.

Colgate fought back as Mike Tennant decided Joe Grizvold 2-1 in a tight bout, which was decided by one point riding time. Then Clarkson Captain

John Babeok up Tech in front 13-6 with a pin of George Young, while Tech's Ron Danilovich lost to Dave Meredith in the 187-lb. class in Danielson's first start. The score was 13-9, and the match was decided for Clarkson by Ron Parrott's fine pin of Bill Lister to give the winners an insurmountable 18-9 lead. To top things off Tech's heavyweight, Dick Ernest of Rochester, decided George Reynolds in the last bout.

Clarkson will meet Ithaca College next Saturday in Potsdam.

Three State Soccermen Are On All-Star Team

A former North Country, high school football star, who played his first game of soccer last Sept. 30 for Potsdam State University College was named the outstanding goalie by the New York State Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Soccer Association. Two other Potsdam State soccer players were named to the Conference's second all-star team.

State Hoop Squad Loses To Plattsburgh

Plattsburgh State broke a 51-51 deadlock with 8:05 minutes to play and went on to spoil Potsdam State's basketball opener, 66-59, here Tuesday night.

Potsdam, down 31-28 at half-time in a game which saw the lead change hands nine times, caught fire at the start of the second half and held the advantage until late in the period when a layup shot by Plattsburgh's Neil Breen put the visitors out in front 49-48.

A shot in close by Mike McCabe and one from far out by Dick Eckert pulled Potsdam back into a tie at 51 all, but three goals on breaking plays and two foul conversions by Plattsburgh within 65 seconds put the game away for the Cardinals.

Junior forward Dick Eckert from Amstardam paced Potsdam with 18 points. Stan Watson scored 10 for the Maroon and Gray who outscored Plattsburgh from the field. The Cardinal's winning margin was at the foul line where they held a 20-11 advantage.

Plattsburgh's five starters, Neil Breen, Wayne Lashaway, Jim Carpenter, Mike Stanton and Bob Genaway, all scored in double figures. Coach Chip Hunter's Potsdam State five will face Oneonta State at home Friday night in another conference game.

CCT Courtmen Defeat Ithaca

The Clarkson Tech courtmen opened their campaign on a winning note here Tuesday night with a fine 74-68 victory over Ithaca College before a good crowd at Alumni Memorial Gym.

For Tech Coach Al Chadwick, it was one of the sweetest wins of his three-year career as head coach, for it was the first time that he has beaten his Alma Mater. Although Bomber mentor Carlton Wood was not happy with the loss, he was among the first to congratulate his former pupil and star player on the victory.

Clarkson tied the score midway through the second half and then went ahead by 10 points. However, at this point Watertown's Don Fazio came alive and swished through 12 of the last 14 points Ithaca scored to keep the Bombers in contention down to the wire. The losers used an all-court press and came within four of tying in the late stages, but couldn't catch the determined Green and Gold.

Ithaca had a 37-34 halftime lead. Dick Maag tallied 8 points to help the Clarkson cause. Carl Putnam of Clayton, had an excellent evening through the hoops as did Jules Pigliacampi, who was surprisingly strong for the winners. Maag tied the score at 45-all with 15:50 left in the contest. Then the Knight eagles zoomed ahead to a 68-56 bulge at one point. However, it was here that Fazio started to hit and Ithaca slowly closed the gap. The Bombers were hindered by fouls, as two players fouled out and several others were on the borderline.

Putnam hit for Clarkson's first nine points of the game, and wound up with a total of 25. Pigliacampi had 16 and Maag garnered 11. Chadwick used an all-veteran quintet for almost the entire contest, which also included Mike Moyer and Bruce Dart, and both performed well for the winners. Fazio was Ithaca's high point man with 16.

This was Clarkson's opening game of the season, while Ithaca is now 1-1. The Knights will entertain Queens of Kingston, Ont. here Friday night and Norwich University Saturday afternoon.


