'62 License Plates Now Available At Office In Canton

Canton — Automobile registrations and number plates for 1962 are now available at the County Clerks' Offices.

Although all registrations and plates actually expire on Dec. 31, except for buses, taxicabs and ambulances, there is an extension of time into January when plates for other vehicles must be attached. None, however, may be displayed before Jan. 1.

On the buses, taxicabs and ambulances, the deadline for 1961 plates is midnight, Dec. 31. Dealer and transporter plates must be installed by midnight of Jan. 10; commercial, tractors, trailers, agricultural and farm vehicle plates by midnight of Jan. 15.

Passenger and suburban vehicles must have their plates displayed by midnight of Jan. 31 as must motorcycles.

Since it is expected that more than five and a half million vehicles will be registered for 1962, the state has urged vehicle owners to obtain their new plates and registrations as early as possible.

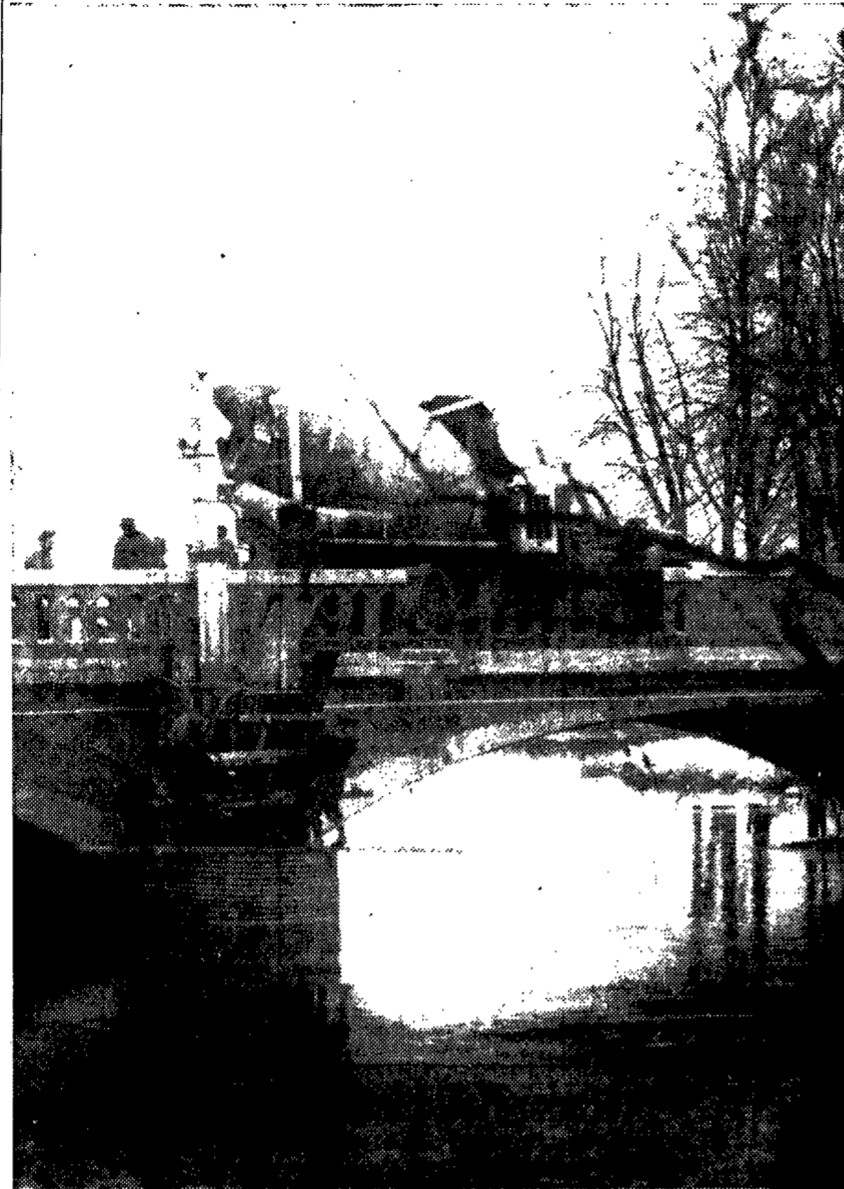

Norfolk Gets \$6,000 US Grant To Extend Water Facilities

Norfolk — The township of Norfolk is the recipient of a \$6,000 interest free loan from the Federal Community Facilities Administration for extension of water facilities to the hamlet of Raymondville within the township.

According to town supervisor Leon Curry a test well has been located and blueprints for the system have been drawn up by their engineer, Warren B. Cavanaugh, Massena.

The total project is estimated at \$364,000 and will include a complete water works and sewage facilities. At the present time neither is available in Raymondville.

Approximately 65 percent of the cost will be supplied by a federal grant with the other 35 percent coming from taxes on assessed property.

Actual construction is expected to begin as soon as the grants are made and the project approved.
