



New Federal Welfare Laws To Mean 12 County Jobs

Canton—St. Lawrence County Welfare Commissioner Leo P. Finley has disclosed that compliance with new federal legislation in the area of public welfare assistance will require hiring at least 12 additional personnel in the Social field plus extra clerical help to take care of the extra paper work.

The new approach emphasizes "rehabilitation" rather than "relief," training for useful work instead of prolonged dependency, and services for self-improvement in addition to support.

Interpretation of the New York State Social Welfare Department in Rehabilitation cases is a joint obligation of local education facilities, New York State Employment Service, and the local Welfare Department, said the Commissioner. The services referred to, however, are the responsibility of the Welfare Department.

The Commissioner also reminded that this Rehabilitation program is not a new idea in St. Lawrence County. The "Work for Relief" project was inaugurated in this county in 1957, and has been used sporadically since that date. This was, in fact, the first county to establish proper plans and procedures for work relief; and many of these procedures were copied in other areas of the State and the Nation.

At the present time, each township and municipality is responsible for its own relief Work Projects.

Relief Tests

Another of this county's pioneering efforts along the line of rehabilitation was that of requesting the New York State Employment Service to run tests on relief recipients. The tests showed that many persons receiving public assistance possessed potential skills and abilities equal to those of high school graduates taking the same tests. Many of these persons subsequently were encouraged to take the high school equivalency tests, with the end result that a large percentage of them passed the test and received high school equivalency diplomas. Since a high school diploma is a requisite for just

about any employment, this activity alone helped not a few persons to become self-supporting. There is on file the record of one such graduate who is presently holding down a \$6000 a year job.

Under the new system, the local Welfare department will have much broader areas of responsibility than determination of eligibility for public assistance—although this latter, and provision for that assistance, will continue to be a major responsibility, of course. Skilled workers will be required to recognize and deal effectively with a wide variety of serious problems that lead to public dependency. These problems may include: physical and mental illness, poor management of household or family funds, unemployment, inadequate care and rearing of children, unmarried parenthood, desertion, non-support, unsuitable living arrangements; and all other problems which make people dependent.

Beginning Feb. 1, 1963, a plan must be developed to meet the needs of every such welfare case. Experience indicates that the majority of the 600,000 public assistance recipients in our State will need such services. Thus, broadly, it will be the duty of the welfare department to: (1) restore families and individuals to self-support; (2) Help the aged, blind, or seriously disabled to care for themselves; and (3) Strengthen family life and otherwise safeguard the physical, mental and moral well-being of children. It is believed that, as more families are strengthened through such services, fewer children will be reared in dependency and other unfavorable circumstances.

Case-load High

This tremendous job cannot be done if the individual case-worker's load is too high. The U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare has established 60 as the maximum caseload per worker for cases that require these special services. Further, the federal agency requires that there be one supervisor for each five case-workers and that there be a statewide training program. The State Welfare Board be-

lieves that the new public welfare system will save public funds now by treating current problems and save public funds in the future by prevention of these problems.

To help in attaining adequate staffs for the new program, Congress amended the Social Security Act in 1962 to increase the Federal Government's share of the administrative costs of these proposed new services from the present federal share of 50 percent to 75 percent.

Finley explained, however, that the intent of the new ruling is easily misunderstood by the layman. As he understands the law, the 75 percent federal reimbursement means only 75 percent of the so-called "special services" as listed above. For instance, it will be necessary to determine what part of the caseworker's time has been spent in routine investigation, such as the determination of financial need and eligibility for assistance, and which category, etc.; and what part, or how many hours and minutes, are spent in investigating.

Time Study

Finley's department is one of only 16 districts in the State which have for several months been conducting time study projects in regard to the various services performed by staff personnel. Thus, when figures are tabulated and released, he will have a working basis, presumably, in determining the percentage of time spent on these special personal services, which are reimbursable under the new ruling.

As soon as the 1963 Welfare Committee has been named by the new Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, Finley will request a meeting with them to discuss the necessity for expanding his staff. He will also furnish them with information on the percentage of salaries which would be reimbursed by the federal government, in accordance with the provisions of services relating to public assistance law 87-543.

The State Board of Social Welfare has warned that failure on the part of any local welfare department to conform to the new requirements may result in loss of a substantial amount of federal funds to both the local welfare department and the State of New York. The Board has sent information on the new ruling to County executives, Family Court judges, Mayors, city managers, and chairmen and members of the County Boards of Supervisors.

St. Lawrence County's Agricultural Conservation Program for 1963 will get under way starting Feb. 1, according to Silas Eakins, chairman of the County Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee.

He points out that the 1963 ACP will be substantially the same as the 1962 Program. County and Community ASC Committees will administer the ACP as in past years.

The Chairman said that farmers will be contacted through Feb. 1 and Feb. 8, at which time they will be given an opportunity to enroll in the 1963 ACP.

Any farmer who is missed in this contact and who wishes to participate has until May 1 to go into the county office to enroll in the 1963 program.

The Agricultural Conservation Program is designed to help farmers establish needed conservation practices on their land. Farmers who have a conservation problem which they are not able to solve with their own resources are encouraged to visit the ASCS County Office to talk it over.
