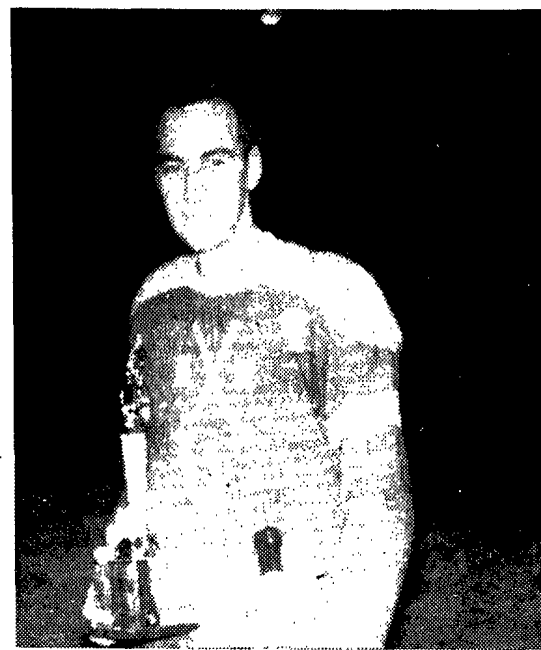


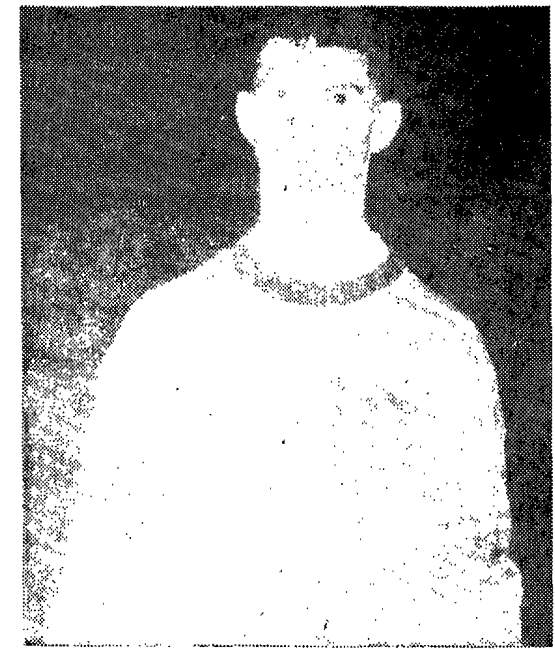

## Four Former Pee Wee Hockey Players Now On College Ice

The young men are Joe Fiacco, Rick Gibson, Charles McLennan and Tom LaBarge. All four have made the hockey team of their respective colleges for the season now in progress.

Joe Fiacco was active in Norwood bantam hockey from 1955 through 1957 while still in grade school. He graduated to high school hockey in 1958 and went on to prove himself time and time again defending the Flying N's banner in the Northern League.

A graduate of NNCS in 1961 he entered Norwich University in Vermont and there made the freshman hockey team that same year. Joe has now progressed to first line wingman on the varsity team this year.

Ricky Gibson began bantam hockey in 1955 and graduated to the high school team in 1956. He played four full years on NNCS ice before enrolling at Houghton College where he now plays defense on the varsity squad.

Mrs. Spencer said she hopes that all her friends of the society will contribute generously when called upon to do so.

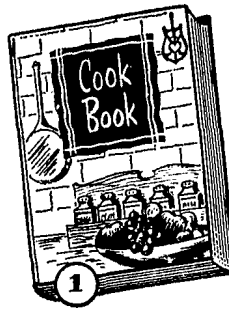
