Earl Brownell Rites Tomorrow

Funeral services will be held tomorrow afternoon for Earl Brownell, 77, of New Rochelle, formerly of Potsdam, who died Monday at 12:05 a.m. in New Rochelle Hospital.

Friends may call tonight at the Garner Funeral Home. The Rev. William A. Caldwell, pastor of the First Methodist Church, Potsdam, will officiate at the services at 2 p.m. tomorrow at Garner Funeral Home. Burial will be in Bayside Cemetery.

Services were held yesterday afternoon in New Rochelle. Mr. Brownell was born in Hopkinton on Mar. 25, 1886, a son of Edwin H. and Minnie Rockwood Sheldon Brownell. He graduated from Potsdam High School and studied for one year at Clarkson College. He received his degree in Industrial Arts from Oswego Teachers College in 1925.

He taught school in New Brunswick, N. J. for two years, then moved to New Rochelle in 1927 where he taught Industrial Arts in the high school until his retirement in 1960. For two years he was a consultant for the Industrial Arts Junior Aviation in the Bureau of Industrial and Technical Education of the State Education Dept. He was also an instructor in aeronautics at New York University, taught aviation in Searsdale Summer School, and was an instructor and lecturer in Science of Pre-Flight Aeronautics Work at the College of New Rochelle.

Mr. Brownell was married twice. He married Miss Ida Kenyon, West Potsdam, in Sept. 1913. In 1934 he was married to Miss Edith Sibley, Bennington, Vt.

He was a member of the New Rochelle Presbyterian Church. Survivors include his wife, Edith Brownell, New Rochelle; one son, Dr. Lloyd Brownell, Professor of Science at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Mich.; three grandsons, two granddaughters, one great-granddaughter; one sister, Mrs. Grace Wellings, Elm St., Potsdam; one niece, Mrs. Elizabeth Wellings Congdon, Pittsfield, Mass.; and one nephew, Donald Wellings, Grant St.

Consecration Of New Bishop To Be Televised Saturday

Area residents are especially interested in the service to be held in All Saints' Cathedral, Albany this Saturday when the venerable Charles Bowen Persell will be consecrated a bishop in the Church of God.

The service will begin at 10:30 a. m. and will be carried on television by the Plattsburgh station, WPTZ, Channel 5.

Before his appointment by Bishop Brown to be his assistant and later his election as Archdeacon of the diocese, Fr. Persell was rector of St. John's Church, Massena. While at Massena he was also Dean of St. Lawrence Diocese.

The presiding bishop of the Episcopal Church will preside at the consecration, and will be assisted by about 15 bishops.
