Sigma Xi Grants \$600 To Howe's For Study

The Society of the Sigma Xi and its associated organization, the Scientific Research Society of America (RESA), announced through the chairman of their grants-in-aid of Research Committee, Dr. Harlow Shapley, an award of \$600 to Mr. and Mrs. Charles A. Howe of Clarkson College. This award is to assist in their study of the orientation in the nitration of 2, 6-dimethylacetophenone and 2, 6-dimethoxybenzaldehyde.

Dr. Howe received his bachelor of arts degree at the University of North Carolina in 1943, his master of arts degree at The University of North Carolina in 1949 and his Ph.D. at The University of North Carolina in 1951. Mrs. Howe received her bachelor of arts degree at the University of Richmond in 1945, and her master of arts degree at The University of North Carolina in 1949.

Dr. Shapley, in making this announcement, stated "Sigma Xi and RESA each year make a number of grants to the most promising scientists at critical points in their research careers. We recognize that many needs are relatively too small for the large foundations to consider and it is to meet these needs that our research funds are maintained."

Founded in 1885, the Society of the Sigma Xi now has 144 chapters and more than 122 clubs in the major colleges and universities in the United States and Canada. Its industrial counterpart, RESA, established in 1947, has 78 branches in major governmental and industrial laboratories. These two organizations, with a combined active membership of 90,000 scientists, jointly sponsor eight national lectureships, publish the "American Scientist", and are currently making awards in support of research annually totaling \$75,000.

Eva S. Clark Service Held

Dr. Thatcher Given Regents Board Position

Dr. Alfred W. Thatcher of The State University College at Potsdam, has been appointed to a two-year term on the new Advisory Board for Teacher Education, Certification and Practice by the New York Board of Regents.

Dr. Thatcher, dean of the college at Potsdam, was one of 12 educators named to the advisory board which will assist the Commissioner of Education. The group will consult and advise on matters pertaining to identifying and selecting competent teachers, appraising and strengthening teacher preparation program, improving and strengthening teacher certification standards and programs for continued education of teachers in service.

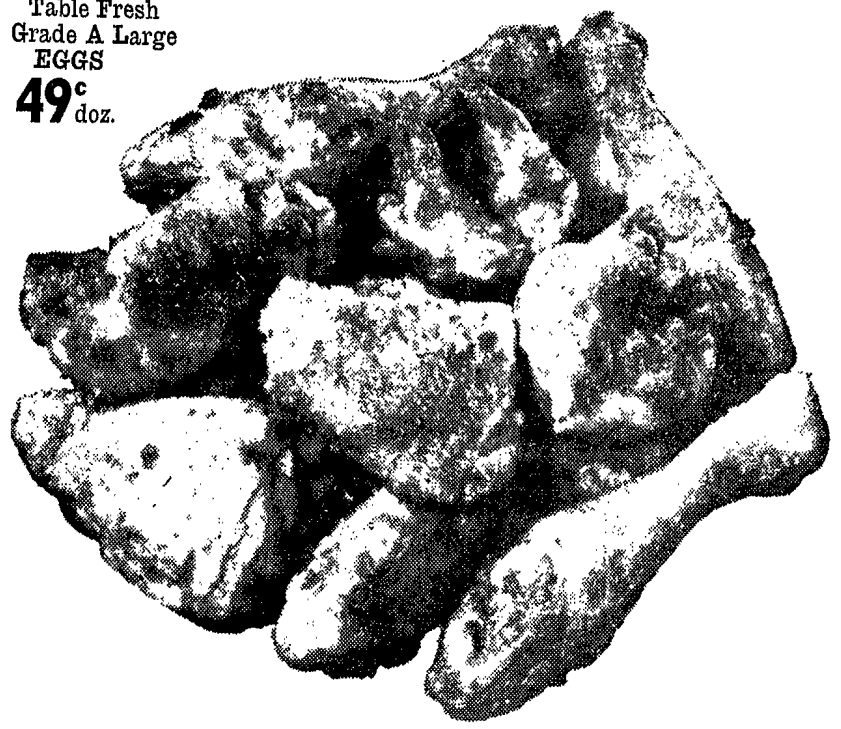
