Funeral Held For John Kilroy

Funeral services for John Kilroy, 62, 6 Canal St. were held Monday morning Feb. 11 with prayers at home at 9 a. m. and a requiem mass at St. Mary's Church at 9:30 a. m. The body was placed in the vault and burial will be in the spring in the Catholic Cemetery, Norwood.

Mr. Kilroy died Friday night at the Potsdam Hospital after a long illness. He was transferred Thursday from Syracuse University Hospital where he had been a patient four weeks. The body was removed to the Garner funeral home and returned to the family home.

Mr. Kilroy was born in Lambertville, N.J. June 5, 1900, a son of Thomas and Catherine Carmody Kilroy. He served four years in the U.S. Navy following World War I. After his discharge, he lived in Saranac Lake for a time.

He married Viola Narrow. The couple lived in Potsdam while he was employed at Alcoa at Massena until he retired because of poor health.

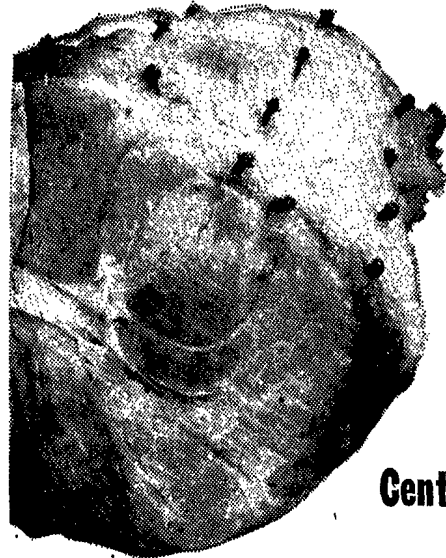

GLAZED BAKED SMOKED HAM (Fully Cooked)
Use whole or half TableRite Smoked Ham. Criss-cross lines into fat with sharp knife. Stick whole clove into each diamond of fat. Place in a covered roasting pan with 2 cups of cider, 7-Up, gingerale, water or other liquid. Cover and bake in 350° F. oven, allowing 30 minutes per pound. When heated through, brush with mixture of brown sugar and prepared mustard, or plain sugar or honey. Return to 450° F. oven. Mixture will caramelize, encrobing Ham in appetizing coating. Serve hot, with lima beans in tomato, sprinkled with grated cheese and baked.
