## Local Witnesses Return Sunday From Conferenc

Jehovah's Witnesses of the Potsdam congregation have returned home from their recent assembly in Watertown. The conference, which included 17 congregations in upstate New York, was termed a definite success by Marshall Cummings, local presiding minister.

Despite the extremely cold weather and the large amount of snow in the Watertown area, all sessions were well attended and exceeded the expectations of convention officials.

The assembly reached a climax Sunday when 851 persons heard Frank Spacil, featured speaker, on the subject "Who Will Win the Struggle for World Supremacy?"

The speaker pointed out, Mr. Cummings commented, that the real struggle is greater than the East-West conflict. In fact, it is no more than a side skirmish in the struggle for world supremacy. The real issue, the speaker said, was raised back in the Garden of Eden when the Devil challenged the supremacy of the Creator.

Continuing, Mr. Cummings added, God's Kingdom spoken of by Jesus and other inspired prophets is the right government for this earth. It will bring a permanent end to the struggle.

Cummings stated that he felt sure that the members of his congregation were greatly aided in their ministry and encouraged by the Bible talks and discussions. All this will assist them in coming days to carry on their local ministry in visiting their neighbors and in home Bible teaching.
