Area Elementary Principals To Hear Of Educational TV

The Northern Zone of the New York State Association of Elementary School Principals is holding a meeting at the State University College at Potsdam today.

The topic "A Plan for the Use of Educational Television in New York State" will be discussed by two representatives of the State Education Department. Speakers are Dr. Lee Campion, director of the Division of Educational Communications, and Dr. Robert Cooper, consultant in Educational Television.

Dr. Campion assumed his position on Sept. 1, 1962. Prior to becoming Director of the Division, Campion was the Associate Investigator for the National Education Association's Technological Development Project. The project was a two-year study of the impact of technology upon education, sponsored by the U. S. Office of Education. He also served the National Education Association as Educational Television Consultant. Between 1963 and 1968 he served as Director of Audio-Visual Education for the St. Louis County Schools. In this capacity Campion represented the county schools on the operations committee of KETC, the St. Louis area educational television station. In addition to the audio-visual responsibilities he produced several public relations television series and a weekly teacher education series. While in St. Louis he taught the Audio Visual classes at Washington University.

Dr. Cooper's background in educational communications is of a broad and varied nature. He has built, managed, operated and trained the staffs of some 14 broadcasting stations (one ETV in the United States). He has worked in instructional programming, guides and manuals, teacher-training and utilization in three countries and in four languages.

Dr. Cooper has worked with ministries of education and higher institutions of learning as both a consultant and a teaching professor of communications and research. Dr. Cooper has taught or trained at all levels and still holds a valid General Secondary Teaching Certificate in the United States. He has been in charge of planning, programming, utilization and production of broadcast materials for two networks (Japanese), and has influenced, or planned and directed the training of more than 100,000 teachers. He has worked with instructional communications for elementary, secondary, and adult and continuing education. Arrangements for the meeting are under the direction of Gregory Tarpinian, principal at Jefferson School, Massena.



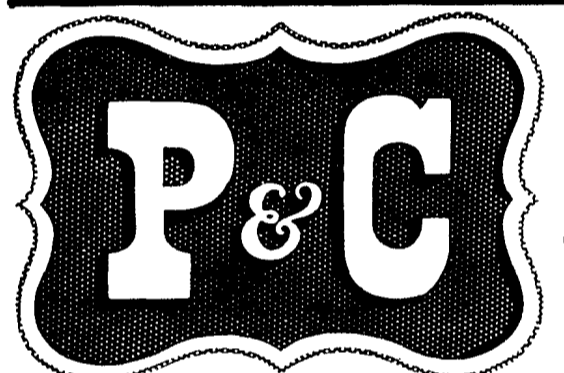
