45 Area Students Enroll In Tech Enrichment Course

Forty-five students from five high schools in Northern New York are participating in the High School Enrichment Program at Clarkson College of Technology this semester.

The students are from Canton Central School, Gouverneur Central School, Potsdam Central School, Salmon River Central School and Norwood-Norfolk Central School.

Robert D. Larsson, professor of mathematics and director of the Enrichment Program at Clarkson, said that this semester's group has 21 students enrolled in chemistry and 24 in mathematics.

The major cost for the High School Enrichment Program is borne by the Boards of Education with help for the administrative portion of the program coming from the National Science Foundation through its "Cooperative College - School Science Program."

Professor Larsson and Assistant Professor Ernest A. Urwing give the lectures in the mathematics area in the enrichment program, while Dr. George L. Jones, Jr. lectures in chemistry.

All the courses were designed at Clarkson for the Enrichment Program. Professor Larsson said the courses do not duplicate either the standard high school courses in the chemistry or mathematics areas or the traditional beginning courses for freshmen in college. They are intended to enrich the background of the students, to motivate them toward science and
