FFA Stresses Farm Safety

Gerald Crump, Future Farmers of America advisor at Potsdam Central School, has announced that the local chapter will observe National FFA Week, Feb. 16-23, by emphasizing farm safety.

Crump stated that the class has a display of posters at the school on farm safety and the subject will be discussed in agriculture class. The chapter also plans to start a safety program of its own within the chapter.

Spilling itself over to areas outside the school, the chapter will also attempt to stress the need for safety conditions around the farm to area farmers.

The FFA is a national organization operating in high schools across the country where agriculture is taught. It is an integral part of the program of instruction in vocational education in agriculture and has organized into 9,000 chapters in some 51 state associations, every American state and in Puerto Rico. There are over 400,000 members.

The local chapter has operated at Potsdam Central School since agriculture was added to the curriculum in 1960. All students of vocational agriculture in grades 9-12 are eligible to be members of the organization providing they have met certain minimum qualifications for membership.

Canton Library Has Children's New Books

Under Literature, for example, there are 11 sub-categories.

Basic to the effectiveness of the exhibit and the whole service are annotated, curriculum-related catalogues with cross-reference, title and author indexes. Numbered in their listings to conform to the numbering of books, they provide direct and quick access to any and all books of one's interest. The catalogues are free to teachers, librarians and other school personnel.

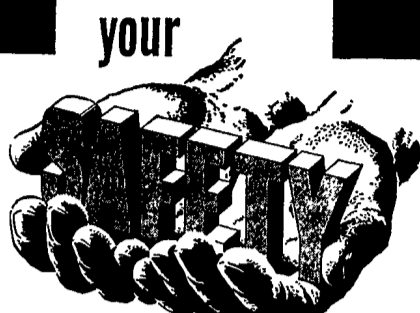

In Boating Safety Class 51 Youngsters

A total of 51 young sailors have enrolled in the Young Boatman's Safety Course which is being sponsored in this area by Potsdam Lions Club.

The course, designed for youngsters between the ages of 10-14, is sponsored by the Conservation Department's Division of Motor Boats.

According to New York State Law, youngsters between those ages must earn safety certificates before they may operate a mechanically propelled boat alone on New York State waters. They are issued safety certificates upon satisfactory completion of the Young Boat-

man's Safety Course.

The course is being conducted at Potsdam Senior High School at 7 p. m. Wednesday nights by Sgt. Al Fuehr Sr. who is a volunteer instructor for the program. Approximately 1,000 such volunteer instructors are teaching the course in boating safety throughout New York State.

All course material is furnished free to youngsters taking the course and to the instructors by the Division of Motor Boats.

Plan books, work books and flip charts, all graphically illustrating basic safety requirements and precautions, are used in teaching the course. This material is based on the boating safety handbook entitled "Make Sure—Make Shore". Every youngster who takes the course is furnished with a copy of this handbook which he may keep after completing the course.
