The Potsdam State cage forces continued their incredible pace this week, chalking up two more wins to stretch their string to 12 straight, with only one game to go on the regular schedule. Last test Maroon and Grey victim was Plattsburgh State, who lost to the local sharpshooters 57-42 in Plattsburgh on Tuesday night.

The forces of Coach Lou LaGrand will make their final appearance of the season Saturday against Oneonta State at 3 p. m. in the State gym. After this, the Potsdam State team will prepare for next weekend's important State University Tournament at Cortland State. Potsdam will be pitted against the finest State University teams of the winter.

In the Tuesday game at Plattsburgh, a crowd of 2,000 screaming fans saw their favorite team fall behind the stubborn Maroon and Grey at the beginning of the contest, never to catch up after that. Potsdam outscored Plattsburgh both from the field and at the foul line. There were at least five State players ill with the flu, but some made the trip, as the locals downed a Plattsburgh team which had been tough at home all year, and had been on a four-game winning streak.

Hal Miller was high for the winners with 17 points followed by Ron Dinehart with 16. The Plattsburgh win was doubly important, as Plattsburgh is also in the State Tournament next week, and Potsdam's win may be an influencing factor in seeding the team. The Oneonta team which the locals meet Saturday, is also in the tournament.

Last Saturday, the Maroon and Grey chalked up number 11 by swamping New York Maritime Academy, 64-27.

Coach LaGrand's Potsdam team put on its finest defensive effort of the season in holding the visitors to just nine field goals, four during the second half. Potsdam now has a defensive team average of 47.5 in 18 games, second best among small colleges in the nation.

Veteran Miller led Potsdam to its 14th victory in 17 starts with a fine performance on both offense and defense, against Maritime. The New York City Center was high with 18 points, set up many other scoring plays and blocked eight Maritime
