St. Lawrence Council Of Churches To Sponsor Duane Holmes Award

The St. Lawrence County Council of Churches is initiating an annual award in recognition of the service of laymen and women in Churches and communities in Churches and communities in the County of St. Lawrence. The Duane H. Holmes Memorial Laymen of the Year Award.

The first award will be made in May of 1963. A committee of the County Council of Churches will make the selection of the recipient from nominations sent in by the Churches, church boards, denominational groups or individual church members. It will consist of a Celtic Cross, to be retained for one year by the recipient.

Duane H. Holmes moved to Massena from Syracuse in 1922, and in the following years, until his death on Mar. 30, 1961, served on nearly every board and committee of the Emmanuel Congregational Church. He was a regular member of the choir, chairman of the music committee and treasurer of the Sunday School, after having formerly served as Superintendent.

For the years 1955-57, he held the position of treasurer of the St. Lawrence County Council of Churches and served as an active member of the board of directors. Following this he was elected to a three year term as a member of the board of directors of the New York State Council of Churches.

In 1956 Holmes played a major role in the organization of the Protestant Chapel and Synagogue Fund Committee for the St. Lawrence County Hospital. He served as treasurer throughout the four years of its existence, and personally handled the finances involved in the payments of pledges of more than 8000 people. He backed the corporation by borrowing \$8000 on his personal note to enable early obligations to be met. At the time he played a leading role in a major fund drive and building program for his own Church.

With a strong concern for youth, he served as a scout master of a troop sponsored by the St. Lawrence County Council of Churches.

Hunting Wrong Set Record
New York hunters would just as soon forget one of the "records" they set last year according to State Conservation Department Fish and Game Law violation reports which show a record number of arrests and fines for October and November—the height of the 1962 small and big game gunning seasons.

William J. Goodman, chief of the Department's Bureau of Law Enforcement, announced that fines and penalties for that two month period totaled \$53,417.50 with 1,388 persons apprehended. This compares with \$34,917.50 in fines and 1,143 arrests for the similar period in 1961.

Although the violators represent a small percentage of the State's one million license holders, Goodman said that Conservation Officers and State Police in many instances worked "around the clock" to control the outbreak of poaching.

High on the list of infractions were cases involving illegal taking of doe deer, jack-lighting and shooting deer during a close season. These violations accounted for the arrest of 139 persons who paid \$19,865 in fines during the 60 day report period.
