State Schedules Speech Program

A six week Summer Speech Center for area students and adults with functional speech problems will be conducted by The State University College at Potsdam, June 29 through Aug. 7.

The program, for persons within commuting distance, will provide continuing assistance to those already receiving instruction during the regular school year and will initiate correction for persons to whom correction facilities have not been available. Pre-school children are not eligible.

The summer session will be devoted entirely to instructional work. At least three appointments will be scheduled per week and additional hours may be scheduled if needed.

Since only 75 persons can be accepted admission will be selective. Applications should be received by May 1. Pre-testing and screening of applicants will be scheduled in June prior to the opening date of the session.
