

Raymond Bouchard, 19, Accident Victim; Rites Conducted Apr. 21

Madrid — Funeral services were conducted Tuesday, Apr. 21, at the Mann Funeral Home in Madrid, for Raymond Joseph Bouchard, 19, with the Rev. Frank Scott officiating. Burial was in Madrid cemetery.

The Bouchard youth died Saturday, Apr. 18 at 5:30 p.m., as the result of injuries sustained in an automobile accident when the car in which he was a passenger apparently went out of control and failed to make a curve on the Norwood-Madrid Road, about two miles from Madrid village.

The car was driven by 20-year old William Lanning, Route 2, Potsdam, according

to Sheriff's Deputies Bernard Cutler, James Sabad, Al Fuhr Jr. and Ralph Travis, who investigated the accident. In their report, the deputies stated that all three occupants of the car were thrown from it. The driver and a second passenger, Robert McDonald, 20, of 120 Main St., Potsdam, were taken by Madrid Rescue Squad to E. J. Noble Hospital Canton, where McDonald was treated by Dr. Harry E. Howe and later released. The driver was reportedly uninjured.

According to the report of investigating officers, the 1958 Ford in which the three youths were riding failed to negotiate a sharp left curve and traveled

300 feet along the right shoulder. The car then crossed to the left shoulder and traveled another 110 feet before rolling over several times, finally coming to rest on its top 150 feet from Route 56A. The car reportedly traveled 560 feet from the time it first left the highway.

Raymond J. Bouchard was born in Potsdam Dec. 26, 1944, only son of Arthur and Marion Barkley Bouchard. He attended Madrid schools and was employed by Ronald Cote, local contractor at the time of his death.

Surviving are his parents, one sister, Agnes, at home;

his maternal grandfather, Emery Barkley, Madrid; his maternal grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Joseph Bouchard, Massena.

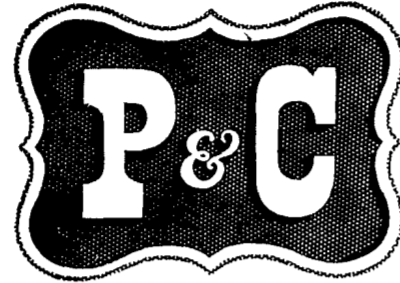
