Dr. Misiaszek Attending Nuclear Engineers Conv

Dr. E. T. Misiaszek, associate of Civil Engineering at Clarkson College, is attending the Third Plovershare Symposium at the University of California, this week.

One of 30 educators chosen from across the United States to participate in the forum, Professor Misiaszek is taking part in formal discussions involving engineering with nuclear devices.

Subsequent to the discussions, the group visited the Nevada Atomic Test Site for a two-day tour of actual surface and underground field installations and full-scale nuclear cratering results.

The Symposium is sponsored by the Lawrence Radiation Laboratory, the American Society for Engineering Education and the American Nuclear Society in cooperation with the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission.

SLC Holds Science Fair

Individual entries by high school students were featured of the St. Lawrence Central School's annual Science Fair on Apr. 20.

The Science Fair has become one of the outstanding academic events on the school calendar and each year features many outstanding projects. Many have later been entered in other area contests as a result of winning blue ribbons at the local fair.
