**Record Numbers Expected To Visit Fairs In State**

Nearly 1,900,000 people of all ages passed through the gates of the 47 county fairs or their equivalent in New York State last year.

Another 462,342 went to the State Exposition at Syracuse. When the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets announced these figures compiled from the fairs' own reports, Agricultural Fairs Representative N. Vincent Gutsch guessed that attendances at fairs operating in 1964 will beat their 1963 marks. The prediction is based on the statewide influence of the World's Fair in making the public more fair-conscious.

The 47 fairs, not counting Syracuse, drew 1,868,190 patrons. Erie County Fair at Hamburg again led the field in county fair attendance with 354,548. The Long Island Exposition at Westbury rolled up 154,709 for second place. That show will not operate this year. The Department has been told, because of its proximity to the World's Fair. In third place was the Eastern Exposition at Altamont with 103,574 and close behind was the Orange County Fair at Middletown with 102,816.

**Clarkson CE Professor To Attend Nuclear School**

How should engineers plan to cope with the disposal of nuclear wastes in the atomic age?

Bradford H. Spring, assistant professor of Civil Engineering at Clarkson College, should have some definite ideas about this by the end of the summer.

Professor Spring has been accepted to attend the Basic Institute on Nuclear Energy at North Carolina State College, Raleigh, N. C., sponsored jointly by the American Society for Engineering Education and the Atomic Energy Commission.

One of seven summer sessions planned by the ASEE and AEC, the institute will present an introduction to the various aspects of nuclear engineering. The purpose of the eight-week course is to provide the participants with the necessary background to teach elementary nuclear-oriented subjects in their field.

According to officials of the New York State Association of Agricultural Fairs, because some fairs fail to count visitors who come in on passes.
