The annual meeting of Eastern Milk Producers Co-operative Association will be held at Hotel Syracuse, Syracuse, June 3 according to an announcement made by John C. York, Dewitt, general manager and executive secretary. A special meeting is called for June 2 making his a two day annual event for the Convention City.

The first day of this dairy producers' meeting will be attended by membership representatives, where matters pertaining to policies and internal governmental procedures will be acted upon. It is expected that 200 farmers from Vermont, Pennsylvania and New York will represent about 9,000 milk producers at this meeting.

Present members should, if possible, invite other Volkswagen owners to attend. Suggestions for activities for the coming year will be welcomed.

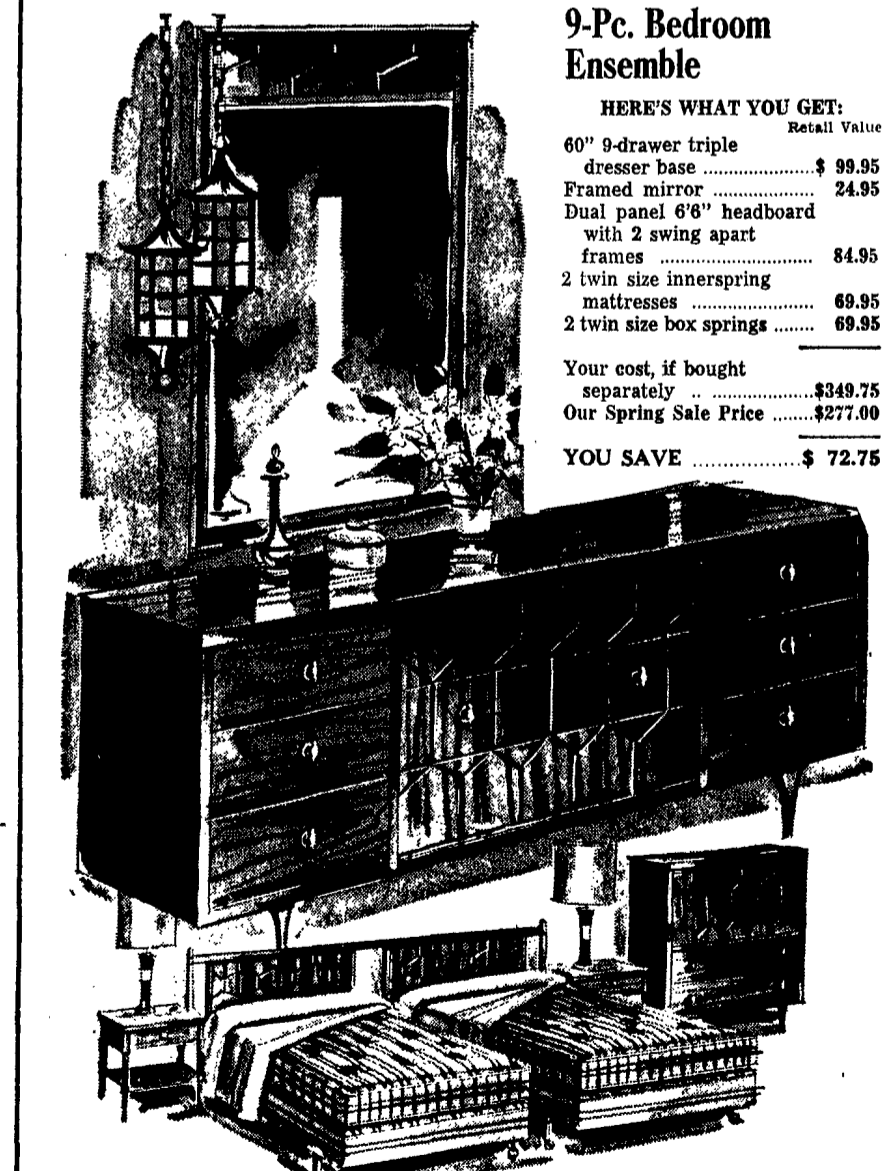
