## Farm Bureau Studying 'War On Poverty' Bill

Farm Bureau members in St. Lawrence County are studying the provisions of the "War on Poverty" bill now before Congress which would carry out the proposals of President Johnson. According to Robert L. Patten of Lawrenceville, president of St. Lawrence County Farm Bureau, an analysis of the bill is being made available to all Kitchen Conferences in the county by James M. Fisher of Madrid, chairman of the Policy Execution Committee on National Affairs. Following study of the bill, members will be writing their opinions to Congressman Kilburn of this district.

"The 'War on Poverty' bill carries a price tag of \$962.5 million the first year and would likely grow to many times this amount in later years," Patten said. He also pointed out that there would be considerable duplication of effort if the bill were adopted without amendment. "For example, annual expenditures for education have increased five times since 1948 to a total of about \$32 billion, and the educational and training provisions of the 'anti-poverty' bill costing upwards of a half-billion dollars could be in duplication to a considerable degree," Patten said.
